Road Reconstruction & Substandard Water Service Replacements on Hartismere Court Road Resurfacing on Collingdale Road

Contract: 16ECS-TI-104LR

Expected Start Date: September 6, 2016

Expected End Date: December 12, 2016

The City of Toronto will resurface the road on Collingdale Road and reconstruct the road on Hartismere Court (see map). The project on Hartismere Court also involves replacing the City-owned portion of substandard water services.

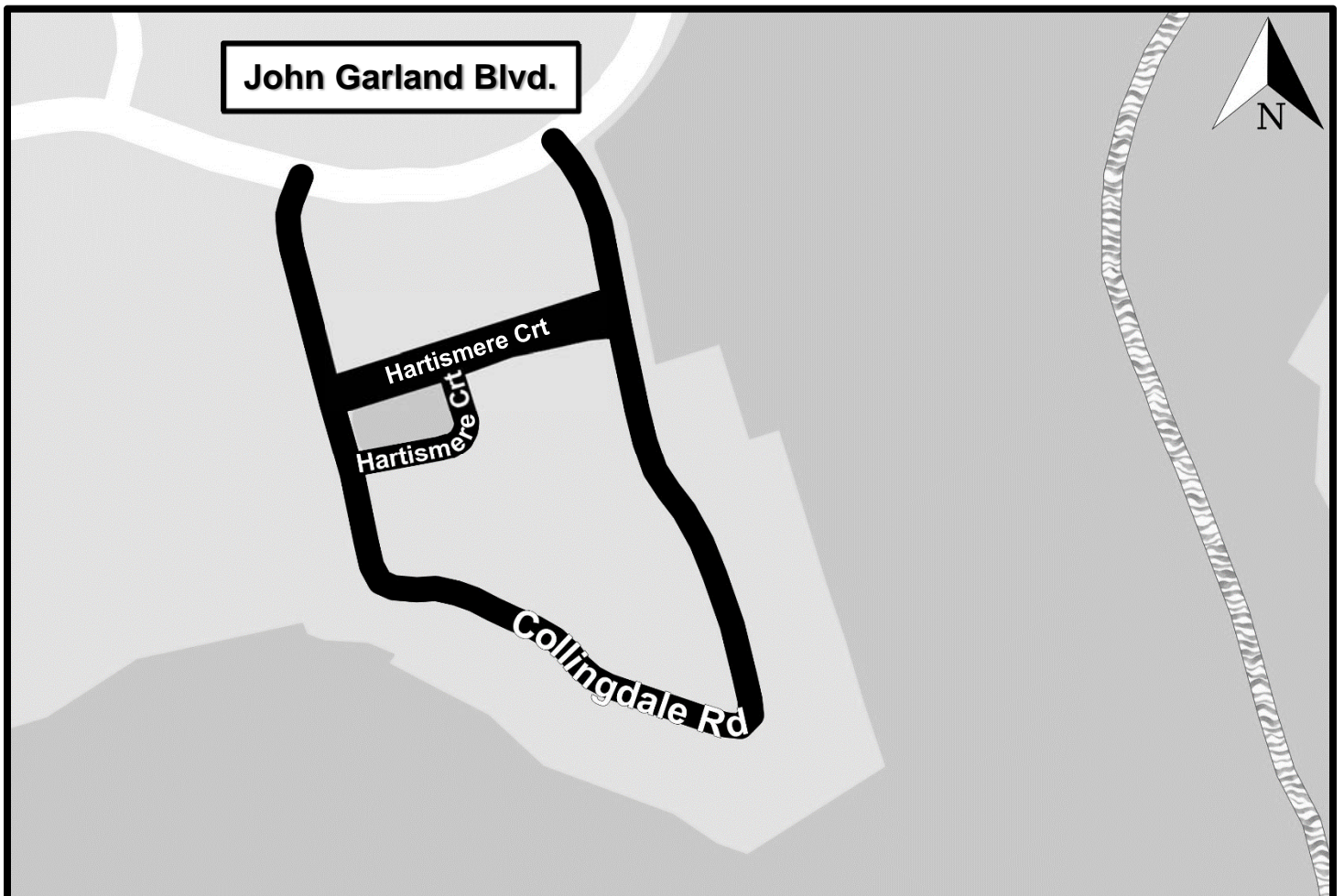
The water service is the underground pipe that brings water to your residence and is owned by you and by the City. The part you own is from your house to the end of your property, the part the City owns is from the end of your property to the watermain.

This project is part of the Council-approved 2016 Capital Works Program to improve water distribution and renew aging city roads and sidewalk for current and future needs

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT LEAD WATER SERVICES

If you live on the streets listed above in a house that was built before the mid-1950s, your water service may be made of lead. Please read the attached fact sheet with important information about the risks of lead in drinking water, especially if someone in your house is pregnant, there are children under six years old, or there is an infant drinking formula made using tap water.

WORK DETAILS



The City's contractor will move equipment on-site and prepare the work area before construction begins. Construction crews will then:

- Excavate and reconstruct the road including removal and replacement of the existing curbs and placing new asphalt and underlying granular materials.
- Replace any water service pipes that do not meet City standards from pipeline to property line.
- Repair necessary curbs and sidewalk areas.
- Restore all work areas with asphalt, concrete, grass, etc.

WHAT TO EXPECT BEFORE CONSTRUCTION

- You will experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce impacts. Your patience is appreciated.
- Property owners should remove items located within City property limits (boulevard or front yard), such as landscaping and / or decorative objects.
- There will be water shut offs for this work. You will be informed of any temporary water service disruptions that affect you.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.

	<p>Work Hours: Work will take place from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.</p>
	<p>Pre-Construction Inspection: OZA Inspections Ltd., under contract to the City of Toronto, will survey all properties within 30 metres of the construction area before construction starts. Participation in the survey is voluntary; however, participating is important in determining if the construction caused damage. The inspection will look at both the interior and exterior of all properties to verify existing conditions. The company will deliver a separate notice requesting time to set up appointments. All inspection staff will be wearing photo identification and carrying photographic equipment during their work.</p>
	<p>Substandard Water Service Replacement: Please take the time to read the attached fact sheet carefully as it contains important information on lead in drinking water and how to prepare for replacement. 	<p>Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.</p> <p>Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.</p>
	<p>Traffic Management: Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Road users should expect some delays.</p>
	<p>Parking: Parking in the active work zone is not permitted due to space requirements for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects the construction work, it will be re-located with no charge to the owner. If your vehicle is moved, please contact parking control for its location at 416-808-2222.</p> <p><i>In the event you receive a traffic ticket for on-street parking during this period of construction, please immediately contact Taras Pawluk (416-806-1763), so that your ticket can be cancelled.</i></p>

	Please note that parking tickets cannot be cancelled if vehicles were parked in illegal parking spots such as in front of a fire hydrant or in no parking zones, or if they are submitted more than three days after receipt.
	Garbage & Recycling: Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them. <i>Please ensure that you label your bins with your address.</i>
	Restoration: The construction work area will be restored with sod and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed from public and private property during construction will be replaced.
