Expected End Date: Fall 2016



The City of Toronto is rehabilitating Beckenham Court, Ulverston Road, Wareside Road, Cambrian Road, Guernsey Drive, Welkin Gate, Groverdale Road, and Carsbrooke Road (see map). The work includes road rehabilitation using the CIREAM (Cold In-Place Recycled Expanded Asphalt Mix) process as well as curb replacement and sidewalk repairs. The CIREAM process is an ecological method of road rehabilitation in which the existing asphalt is recycled and placed back down as the asphalt base layer.

Forestone Road is being fully reconstructed because of grading constraints that would have arisen if the CIREAM process was used there. Full road reconstruction differs from the CIREAM process in that all the existing materials of the road are removed and replaced (i.e. granular base materials and asphalt). There will also be new curb and gutter on both sides and concrete sidewalk on the east side along Forestone Road.

This work is needed to bring the road and sidewalk to a state of good repair. This project is part of the Council-approved 2016 Capital Works Program to renew aging infrastructure.

WHAT TO EXPECT BEFORE CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.
- Work crews will mark sidewalks and curbs requiring replacement and the locations of underground utilities, such as gas, water and cable so that the construction work does not interfere with these utilities.
- Affected properties will receive a Construction Notice approximately two weeks before work begins with more information about the work.
- Work in the boulevard in front of homes and commercial properties is expected. This work includes removing and replacing driveways, municipal sidewalks and grassed boulevards, where necessary.
- Property owners should remove items located within City property limits (boulevard), such as landscaping and or decorative objects before work starts. If you have a sprinkler system within the boulevard, please contact the Field Ambassador listed below.



Accessible Accommodation: Residents who require accommodation (level entry, longer notice, etc.) must contact the **Field Ambassador** to arrange for access during the construction period.
