Watermain Replacement and Road Resurfacing On The East Mall from Bloor Street to West Deane Park Drive

End Date: September 2017

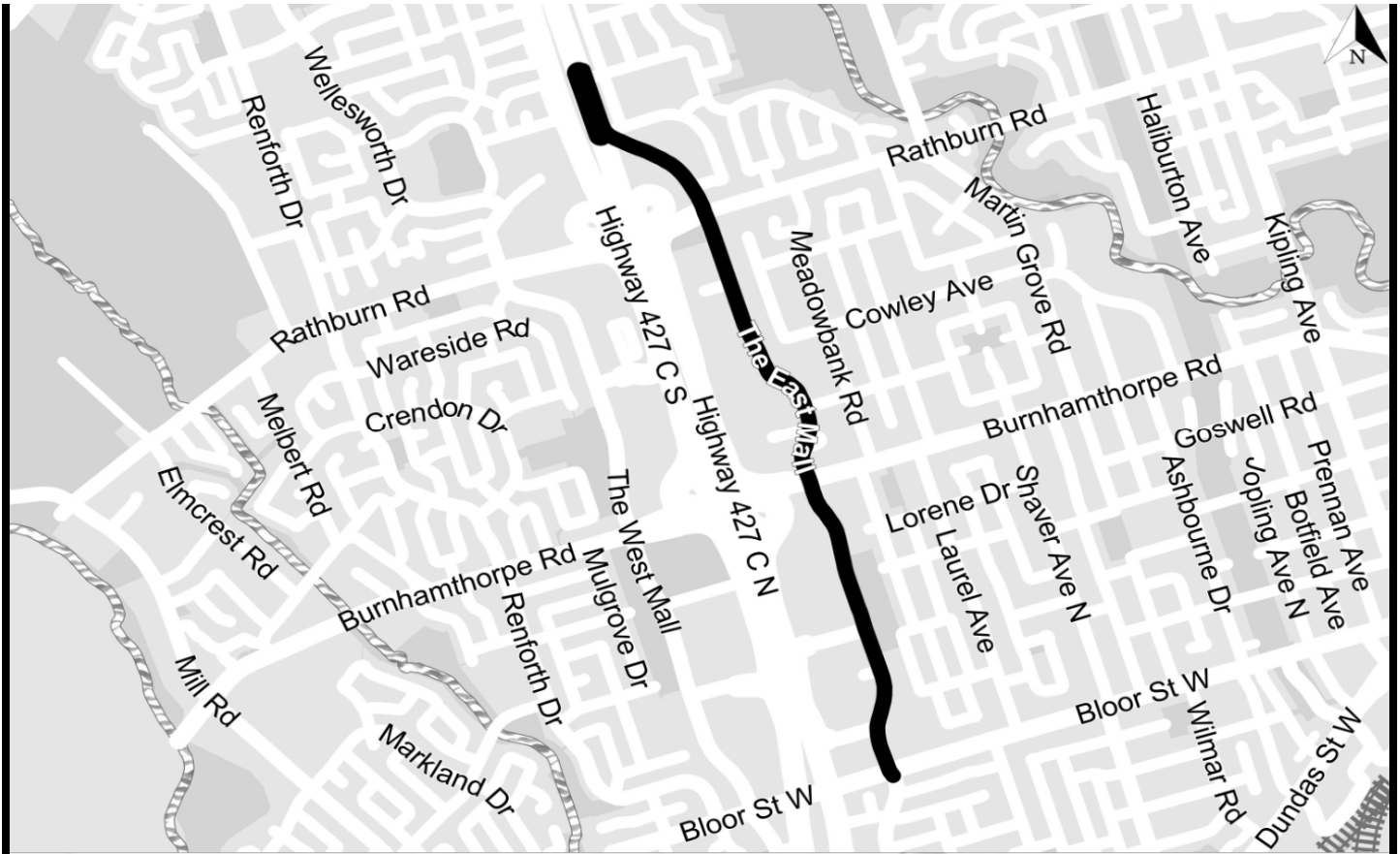

The City of Toronto is planning to replace the watermain and City-owned portions the water services on The East Mall from Bloor Street to Burnhamthorpe Road. This project also includes road resurfacing of The East Mall from Bloor Street to West Deane Park Road.

The water service is the underground pipe that brings water to your home / business and is owned by you and by the City. The part you own is from your house to the end of your property, the part the City owns is from the end of your property to the watermain.



This project is part of the Council-approved 2017 Capital Works Program to renew our aging water road and water infrastructure, improve water distribution and reduce the risk watermain breaks.

WHAT TO EXPECT BEFORE CONSTRUCTION

- Work crews will mark the locations of underground utilities, such as gas, water and cable so that the construction work does not interfere with these utilities.
- Affected properties will receive a Construction Notice approximately two weeks before work begins with more information about the work.
- Work in the boulevard in front of homes and commercial properties is expected. This work includes removing and replacing driveways, municipal sidewalks and grassed boulevards, where necessary.
- Property owners should remove items located within City property limits (boulevard), such as landscaping and or decorative objects before work starts. If you have a sprinkler system within the boulevard, please contact the Project Manager listed below.

	<p>Accessible Accommodation: Residents who require accommodation (level entry, longer notice, etc.) must contact the Project Manager to arrange for access during the construction period.</p>
	<p>Access to Your Home: The City-hired contractor may need access to your home to complete a pre-construction survey. Affected properties will receive a pre-construction survey request to schedule a time to complete the survey.</p>
