Sanitary Trunk Sewer Rehabilitation in the Humber River Valley from Raymore Drive to Erinbrook Court

Expected Start Date: Winter 2016

Expected End Date: Fall 2018

The City of Toronto will be rehabilitating a 2.5 km long section of the Humber Sanitary Trunk Sewer (STS) located in the Humber River Valley along Scarlett Road from Raymore Drive to Erinbrook Court (see map on reverse).

The Humber STS is a large underground pipe that collects sanitary wastewater from various sewers and conveys it to the Humber wastewater treatment facility. The STS has corrosion-related issues and the rehabilitation project will enhance the life of the STS by 50-100 years. This project is part of the Council-approved 2016 Capital Works Program.

WHAT TO EXPECT BEFORE CONSTRUCTION

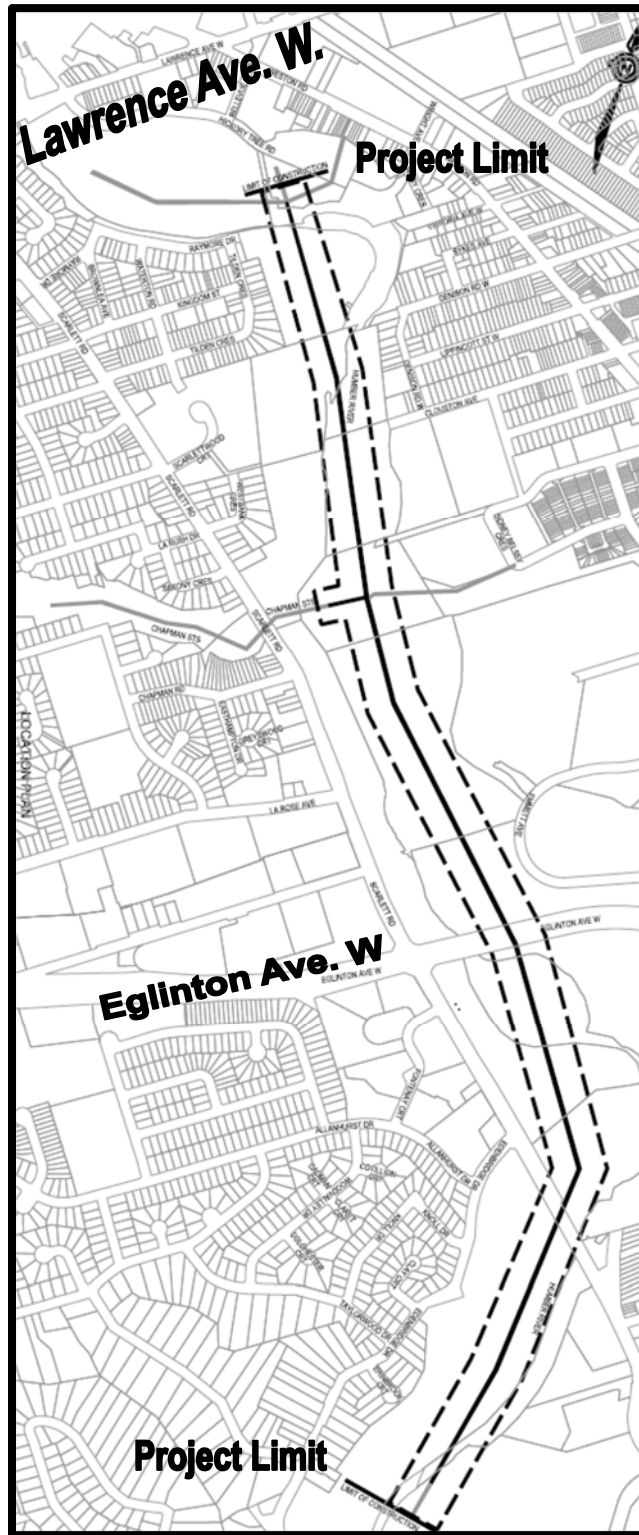
- Tree removal and pruning is required along the sanitary trunk sewer to create an access path.
- Tree removal work is planned to start in **January 2016 and be complete by March 2016** to avoid the nesting period of migratory birds.
- Toronto and Region Conservation Authority (TRCA), Ministry of Natural Resources and City – Parks, Forestry & Recreation (PF&R) Division reviewed and approved the tree removal.
- Affected properties will receive a Construction Notice approximately two weeks before work begins with more information about the work.
- All areas affected by work will be restored.
- Trees and shrubs will be replanted as approved by the TRCA and PF&R when will be implemented upon completion of sewer rehabilitation.
