## Road Reconstruction on Maydolph Road from Laurel Avenue to Northhampton Drive

**Contract: 16ECS-TI-12LR**

**Expected Start Date: November 14, 2016**

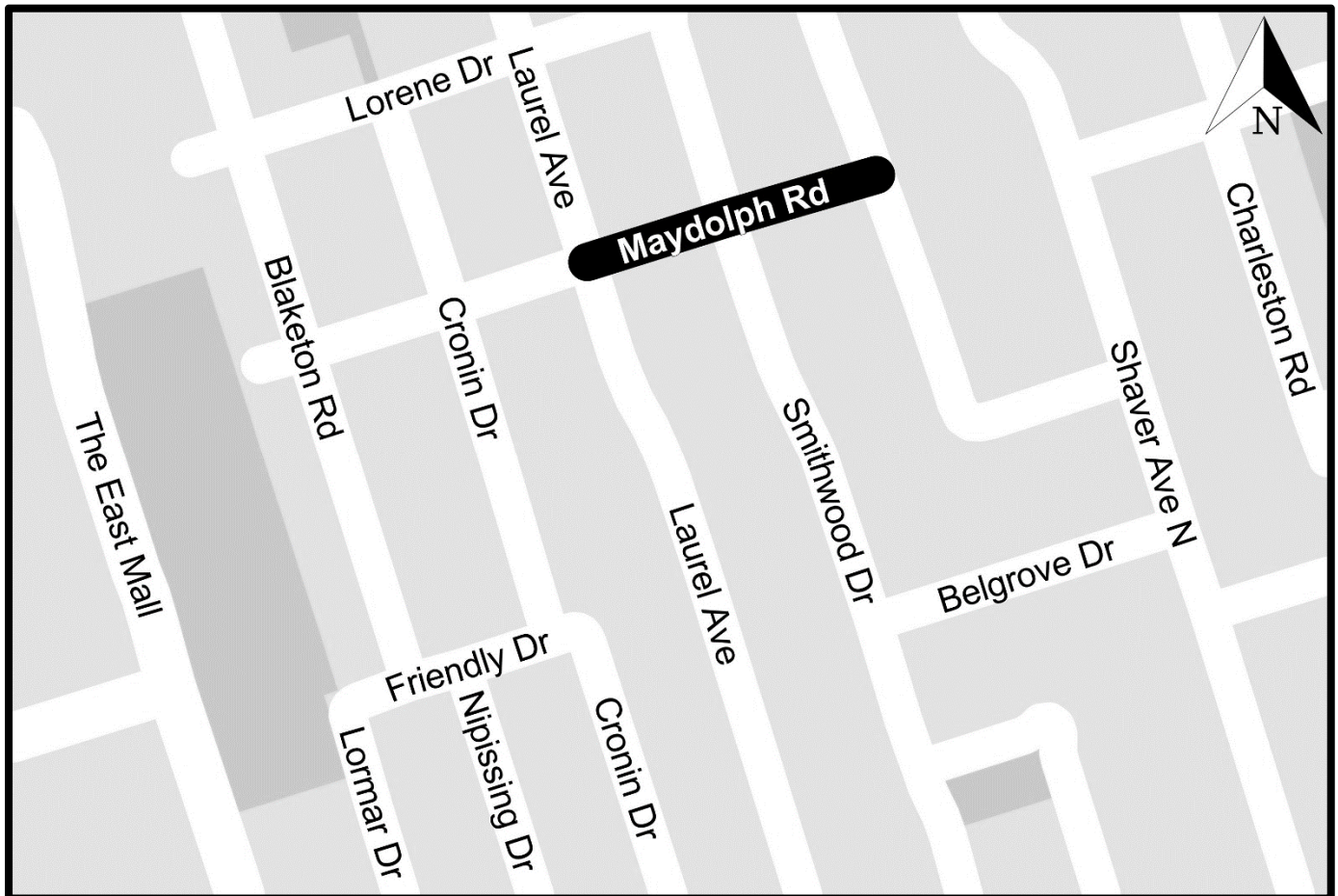
**Expected End Date: November 30, 2016**

The City of Toronto will be reconstructing Maydolph Road from Laurel Avenue to Northhampton Drive. Our inspection of the road shows that it needs reconstruction and needs to be replaced to bring them to a state of good repair. Ditches will also be regraded where required.

This project is part of the Council-approved 2016 Capital Works Program to renew aging city laneways for current and future needs.

## WORK DETAILS


The City's contractor will move equipment on-site and prepare the work area before construction begins. Construction crews will then:

- Excavate and reconstruct the road, removing the existing asphalt and granular base and replace it with new granular base and asphalt
- Regrade ditches where required.

## WHAT TO EXPECT BEFORE CONSTRUCTION

- You will experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce impacts. Your patience is appreciated.
- Property owners should remove items located within City property limits (boulevard or front yard), such as landscaping and / or decorative objects.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.

	<p><b>Work Hours:</b> Work will take place from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.</p>
	<p><b>Road and Sidewalk Access:</b> In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.</p> <p><b>Driveway Access:</b> The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access.</p>
	<p><b>Traffic Management:</b> Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Road users should expect some delays.</p> <p><b>Traffic will be restricted to one lane when required.</b></p>
	<p><b>Parking:</b> Parking in the active work zone is not permitted due to space requirements for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects the construction work, it will be re-located with no charge to the owner. If your vehicle is moved, please contact parking control for its location at <b>416-808-2222</b>.</p>
	<p><b>Garbage &amp; Recycling:</b> Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them. <b><i>Please ensure that you label your bins with your address.</i></b></p>
	<p><b>Restoration:</b> The construction work area will be restored with sod and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed from public and private property during construction will be replaced. Sod restoration may be completed in the spring of 2017.</p>

	<p><b>Accessible Accommodation:</b> Residents who require accommodation (level entry, longer notice, etc.) must contact the <b>Field Ambassador</b> to arrange for access during the construction period.</p>
