Laneway Reconstruction south of Lake Shore Boulevard West (east of Tenth Street & east of Sixth Street)

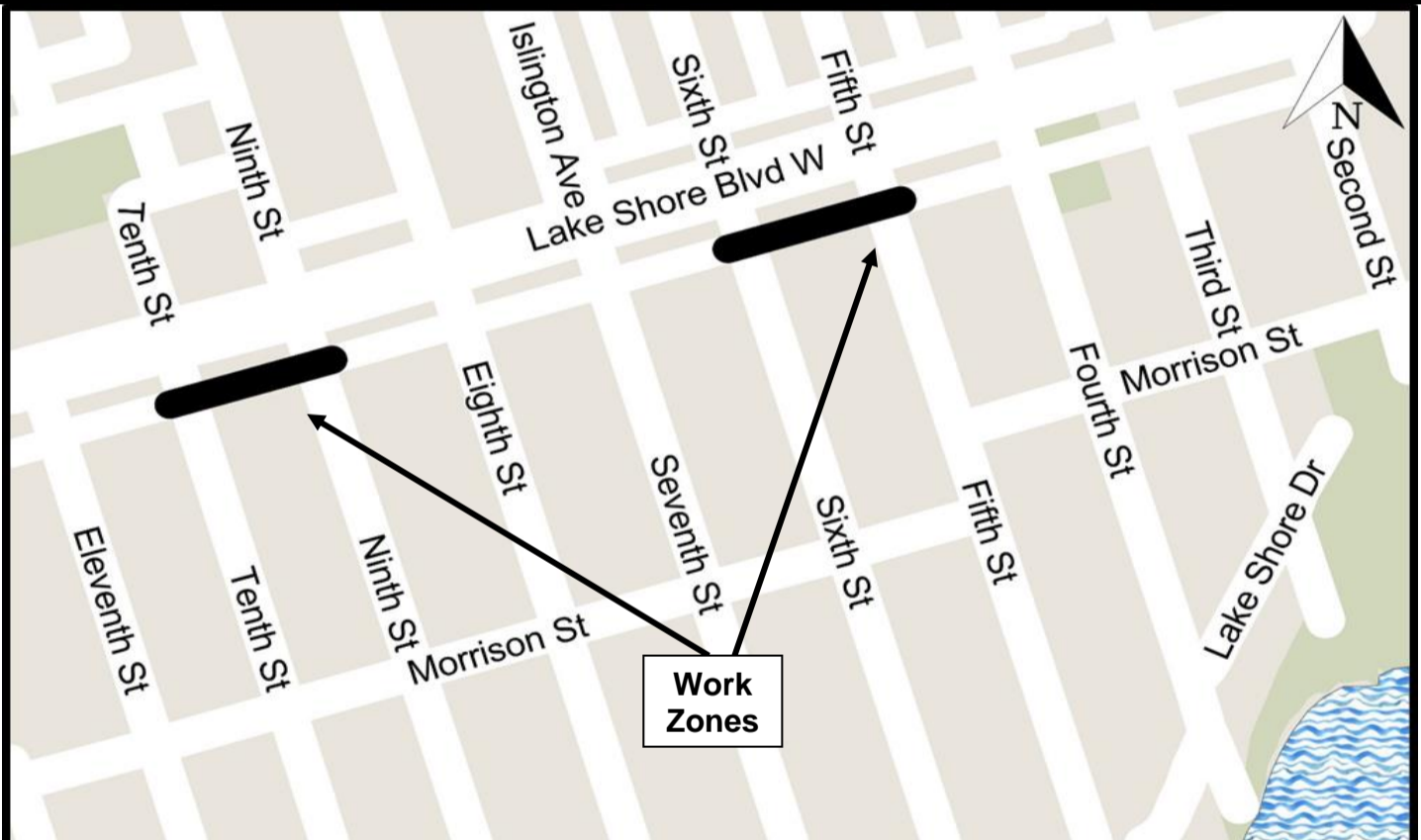

The City of Toronto will reconstruct the laneway south of Lakeshore Boulevard West in two sections, east of Tenth Street and east of Sixth Street (see map). Our inspection of the laneway shows that it needs reconstruction to bring them to a state of good repair.

This work is part of the Council-approved 2016 Capital Works Program to renew aging city roads, lanes and sidewalk for current and future needs.

WORK DETAILS

In the first few weeks, the City's contractor will move equipment on-site and prepare the work area before construction begins. Construction crews will then:

- Dig up the laneway surface
- Re-align maintenance holes and catch basins
- Construct the sub-base and base
- Construct and lay concrete pavement

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.
- Property owners should remove items located within City property limits (boulevard), such as landscaping and / or decorative objects. If you have a sprinkler system within the boulevard, please contact the Project Manager.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.

	<p>Work Hours: This project will use work hours from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m., Monday to Friday, 9:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. on Saturdays to reduce the project duration.</p>
	<p>Pre-Construction Inspection: Contractor's subcontractor OZA Inspection, will survey all properties within 30 metres of the construction area before construction starts. Participation in the survey is voluntary; however, participating is important in determining if the construction caused damage. The inspection will look at both the interior and exterior of all properties to verify existing conditions. The company will deliver a separate notice requesting time to set up appointments. All inspection staff will be wearing photo identification and carrying photographic equipment during their work.</p>
	<p>Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions in the work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.</p> <p>Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.</p>
	<p>Traffic Management:</p> <p>Traffic in the laneway will be restricted to local and emergency vehicle (Paramedics, Fire, Police) access.</p>
	<p>Parking: Parking in the active work zone is not permitted due to space requirements for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects the construction work, it will be re-located with no charge to the owner. If your vehicle is moved, please contact parking control for its location at 416-808-2222.</p> <p><i>In the event you receive a traffic ticket for on-street parking because your car has been moved during this period of construction, please immediately contact the Project Manager listed below, so that your ticket can be cancelled.</i></p> <p>Please note that parking tickets cannot be cancelled if vehicles were parked in illegal parking spots such as in front of a fire hydrant or in no parking zones, or if they are submitted to the Project Manager no later than three days after receipt.</p>
	<p>Garbage & Recycling: Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them. <i>Please ensure that you label your bins with your address.</i></p>
	<p>Restoration: The construction work area will be restored with sod and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed from public and private property during construction will be replaced. Lawn seeding and/or laying of sod will be done as needed during ideal growing seasons only - in the spring (April to June) and fall (September to October).</p>
