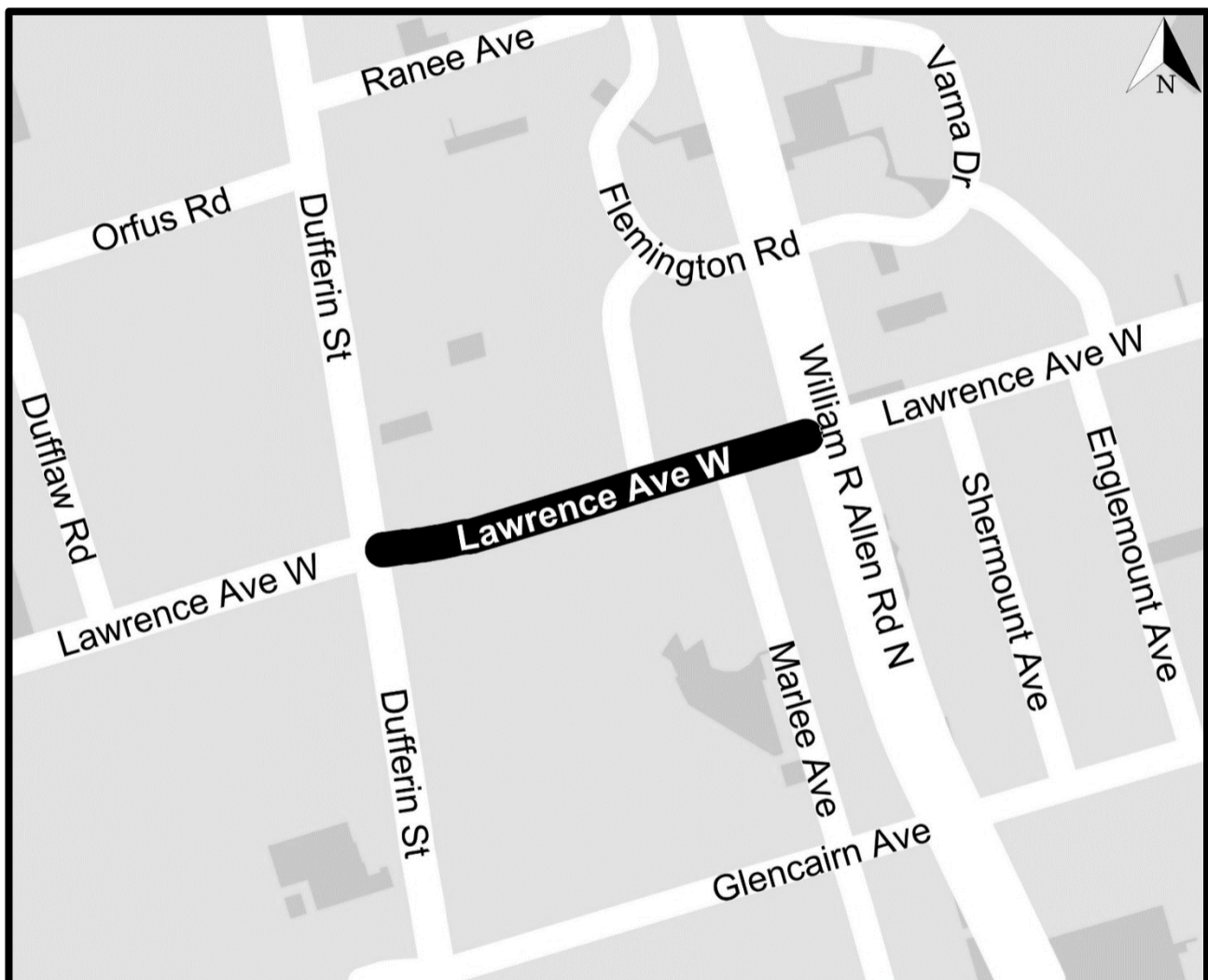
## Road Resurfacing on Lawrence Avenue from Dufferin Street to WR Allen Road

**Contract: 16ECS-TI-05MR**  
**Start Date: October 17, 2016**  
**End Date: December 2, 2016**  
*\*Timeline is subject to change.*

The City of Toronto will resurface the road on Lawrence Avenue from Dufferin Street to WR Allen Road. Our inspection of the road shows that it needs resurfacing and sections of damaged curb and sidewalk need to be replaced to bring them to a state of good repair.

This work is part of the Council-approved 2016 Capital Works Program to renew aging city roads and sidewalk for current and future needs.

### WORK DETAILS








The City's contractor will move equipment on-site and prepare the work area before construction begins. Construction crews will then:

- Repair curbs and gutters, sidewalks, boulevards and driveways where necessary
- Grind the existing road surface and repave with first layer of new asphalt, on one half of road at a time
- Adjust the tops of maintenance holes and catch basins
- Repave the road surface with the second layer of new asphalt followed by final lane painting.

### WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise, traffic delays and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.

- Property owners should remove items located within City property limits (boulevard), such as landscaping and/or decorative objects. If you have a sprinkler system within the boulevard, please contact the Project Manager.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.

	<b>Work Hours:</b> Work will take place from 7:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m., Monday to Friday and 9:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m. on Saturday.
	<b>Road and Sidewalk Access:</b> In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times. <b>Driveway Access:</b> The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access.
	<b>Traffic Management:</b> Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Road users should expect moderate to significant delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets. <b>Traffic on Lawrence Avenue will be reduced to a minimum of one lane in each direction for most of the construction.</b>
	<b>Parking:</b> Parking in the active work zone is not permitted due to space requirements for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects the construction work, it will be re-located with no charge to the owner. If your vehicle is moved, please contact parking control for its location at <b>416-808-2222</b> .
	<b>Garbage &amp; Recycling:</b> Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them. <b>Please ensure that you label your bins with your address.</b>
	<b>TTC Service:</b> This project may affect travel times on the 52 Lawrence West, 59 Maple Leaf and 109 Ranees bus routes. Visit <a href="http://ttc.ca">ttc.ca</a> for accurate schedule information.
	<b>Restoration:</b> The construction work area will be restored with sod and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed from public and private property during construction will be replaced.
