
Watermain Replacement on Bathurst Street and Eireann Quay

Contract: 16ECS-LU-03SU
Start Date: September 6, 2016
End Date: November 19, 2016
**Timeline is subject to change.*

The City of Toronto will replace the 1920s-era watermain with a new, larger watermain on Bathurst Street from Lakeshore Boulevard to Queens Quay and on Eireann Quay.

This project is part of the Council-approved 2016 Capital Works Program to renew our aging infrastructure, improve water distribution and reduce the risk watermain breaks.

WORK DETAILS

The City's contractor will move equipment on-site and prepare the work area before construction begins. Two crews will work at either end of the project and meet at the intersection of Bathurst and Queens Quay.

Construction crews work will involve:

- Excavating the road and digging a trench to access and install the new watermain
- Replacing any City-owned water service pipes that do not meet City standards from the watermain to the private property line
- Restore all work areas with asphalt, concrete or grass when the underground works are complete

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- Before work begins, a photo-survey company, retained by the Contractor under the City of Toronto, will contact you to arrange for an optional photographic survey of the interior of your property.
- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.
- Property owners should remove items located within City property limits (boulevard), such as landscaping and / or decorative objects.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.

	<p>Work Hours: The work will generally take place from 10:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m. Monday night to Friday night with some work during the day on weekends as required (9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.).</p> <p>Overnight work allows the road to remain open and free of work during the day and reduces the interruption to TTC Streetcar service in the community.</p>
	<p>Pre-Construction Inspection: A photo-survey company retained by the Contractor under contract to the City of Toronto, will survey all properties within 30 metres of the construction area before construction starts. Participation in the survey is voluntary; however, participating is important in determining if the construction caused damage. The inspection will look at both the interior and exterior of all properties to verify existing conditions. The</p>

	company will deliver a separate notice requesting time to set up appointments. All inspection staff will be wearing photo identification and carrying photographic equipment during their work.
	Water Service Disruptions: From time-to-time, the water supply to your property will be shut-off to complete construction; the contractor will provide at least 24-hour advance notice. Throughout the work, it is recommended that you temporarily disconnect any water treatment systems (i.e. softeners or filters), water-cooled air conditioners or similar plumbing fixtures. Automatic lawn sprinkler systems may also be affected, therefore, you may need to water manually. In the event you did not received advanced notice, an emergency water shut off could have been necessary.
	Substandard Water Service Replacement: Please take the time to read the attached fact sheet carefully as it contains important information on lead in drinking water and how to prepare for replacement. If you want to replace your part of the water service pipe, contact the City's contractor for one of your quotes. 	Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times. Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.
	Traffic Management: Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. As a part of this work, southbound lanes on Bathurst will typically be closed from Lake Shore Boulevard West to Queens Quay, from 10:00pm to 6:00 am, Monday night to Friday night.
	Parking: Parking in the active work zone is not permitted due to space requirements for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects the construction work, it will be re-located with no charge to the owner. If your vehicle is moved, please contact parking control for its location at 416-808-2222 .
	Garbage & Recycling: Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them. Please ensure that you label your bins with your address.
	Restoration: The construction work area will be restored with sod and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed from public and private property during construction will be replaced.
