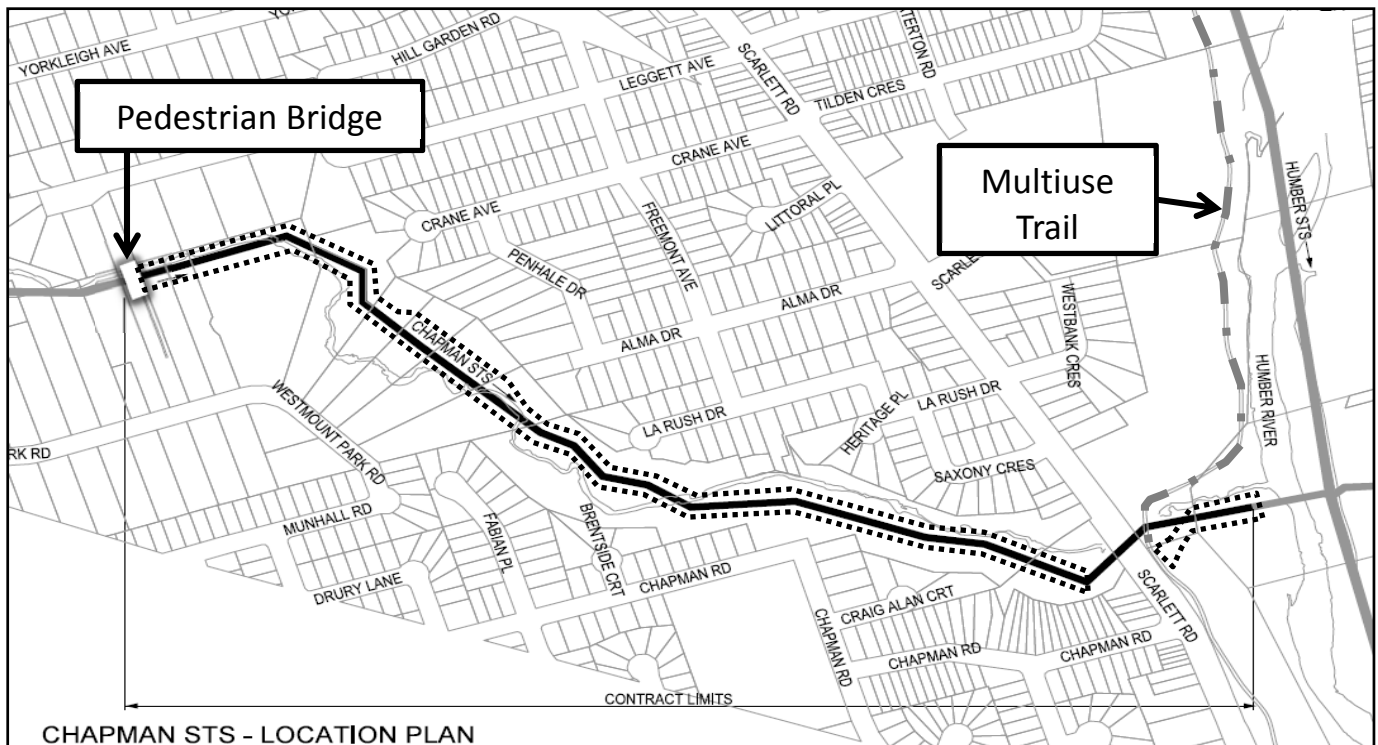
## Repairs to Chapman Sanitary Trunk Sewer

**Start Date: October 05, 2015**

**End Date: Fall 2016**

The City of Toronto will rehabilitate/repair a section of the Chapman Sanitary Trunk Sewer (STS) as depicted on the figure below, under Contract No. 15EY-07TT. The project will extend the service life of the Chapman Sanitary Trunk Sewer.

### WORK DETAILS

Phase-2 construction work will commence in October-2015 and be completed by Fall-2016. Phase-2 construction work includes:

- Constructing access to the sewer
- Installing temporary bypass pumps and pipes to divert flow temporarily outside the sewer
- Relining sewer piping
- Rehabilitation of maintenance holes
- Restoration work upon completion of the sewer repair work including trees and shrubs planting, asphalt and concrete repairs on road, complete seeding and cleaning and other approved restoration work to naturalize the area

### WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise, trail closures, and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.
- There is a potential for sewer service interruptions for this work that may inhibit you from running water or flushing toilets. However, you will be informed of any temporary sewer service disruptions that affect you through a separate notice. In the event that a sewer service interruptions is scheduled to last longer than 2 hours, a portable washroom facility will be provided for public use.
- Property owners should remove items located within City property limits (boulevard & easement), such as landscaping and / or decorative objects. If you have a sprinkler system within the boulevard and/or City easement, please contact the Project Manager.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property or on the easement.

	<b>Work Hours:</b> Work will take place from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m., Monday to Friday. However the sewer lining curing process once initiated takes 8-10 hours and hence temporary sewer bypass pump operation and construction activity may continue for extended hours in some cases.
	<b>Sewer Service Disruptions:</b> If the sewer service from your property requires a disruption to complete construction the contractor will provide at least 24-hour advance notice. During sewer service disruptions, you will be advised not to run water in your home or flush toilets.
	<p><b>Road and Sidewalk Access:</b> In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.</p> <p><b>Driveway Access:</b> The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.</p> <p><b>Trails:</b> There will be closures of the multiuse trail off Scarlett Road and the Bridge off Westmount Park Road during a portion of the construction duration. Signs will be in place to inform about the closure and possible alternates where feasible.</p>
	<b>Traffic Management:</b> Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Road users should expect some delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets.
	<p><b>Parking:</b> Parking in the active work zone is not permitted due to space requirements for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects the construction work, it will be re-located with no charge to the owner. If your vehicle is moved, please contact parking control for its location at <b>416-808-2222</b>.</p> <p><i>In the event you receive a traffic ticket for on-street parking during this period of construction, please immediately contact the Resident Representative M'Hamed Rezali at 647-780-3455 so that your ticket can be cancelled.</i></p> <p>Please note that parking tickets cannot be cancelled if vehicles were parked in illegal parking spots such as in front of a fire hydrant or in no parking zones, or if they are submitted to the <b>Inspector</b> later than <b>three days</b> after receipt.</p>
	<b>Garbage &amp; Recycling:</b> Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them. <i>Please ensure that you label your bins with your address.</i>
	<b>Restoration:</b> The construction work area will be restored with trees, shrubs, sod, seed, concrete and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed from public and private property during construction will be replaced. Lawn seeding and/or laying of sod will be done as needed during ideal growing seasons only - in the spring (April to June) and fall (September to October).
	<b>TTC Service:</b> TTC Service is not expected to be impacted by this project. Visit <a href="http://ttc.ca">ttc.ca</a> for accurate schedule information.
