Chapman Sanitary Trunk Sewer Repair work

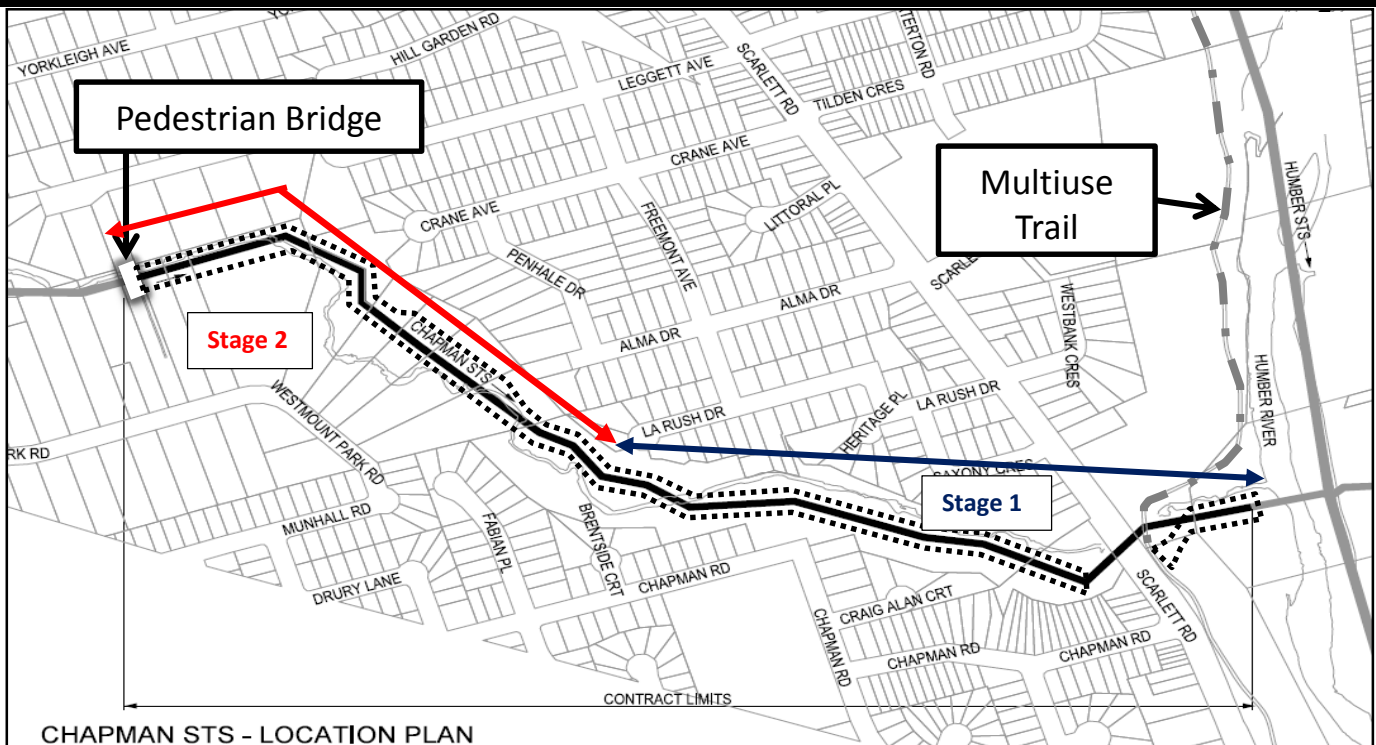

Construction work on the Chapman Sanitary Trunk Sewer (STS) is proceeding well. The purpose of the project is to extend the service life of the Chapman STS.

WORK DETAILS

Construction started in October-2015. Construction work is broken down in to two areas/stages.

Stage 1 construction work is ongoing in the area from La Rush Dr. to Humber River on the east of Scarlett Rd. Bypass pipes and pumps are being installed to divert sewer flow temporarily outside the sewer and then relining work will start. The major construction activity within Stage-1 area will be completed this summer. Crews will then complete restoration work.

Stage 2 construction will take place between the pedestrian bridge near 20 Westmount Park Rd. and La Rush Dr. The contractor will start building an access path in this area while crews complete the sewer relining work to the east. The construction activity within the Stage-2 area will be completed this fall with restoration work following.








WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise, trail closures, and other minor inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property or on the easement.

Private Properties and Work Zone

A section of the Chapman STS passes through City easements on private properties. All residents are reminded that a section of Humber Creek and Chapman Ravine is within private properties and consent from the property owner(s) is required before entering or crossing private properties.

Residents must not enter the construction zone (fenced off areas) even if there is no active construction. Only qualified staff of the contractor can enter the work zone due to Health & Safety requirements and Ministry of Labour guidelines.

	<p>Work Hours: Work will take place from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m., Monday to Friday. When the sewer lining curing process starts it takes 8-10 hours. There will be temporary sewer bypass pumps in operation and construction activity may require extended hours in some cases.</p>
	<p>Sewer Service Disruptions: If the sewer service from your property requires a disruption to complete construction, the contractor will provide at least 24-hour advance notice. During sewer service disruptions, you will be advised not to run water in your home or flush toilets.</p>
	<p>Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.</p> <p>Trails: There have been and will be closures of the multiuse trail off Scarlett Road and the Bridge off Westmount Park Road during a portion of the construction duration. Signs will be in place to inform about the closure and possible alternates where feasible.</p>
	<p>Traffic Management: Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Road users should expect some delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets.</p>
	<p>Parking: Parking in the active work zone is not permitted due to space requirements for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects the construction work, it will be re-located with no charge to the owner. If your vehicle is moved, please contact parking control for its location at 416-808-2222.</p> <p><i>In the event you receive a traffic ticket for on-street parking during this period of construction, please immediately contact the Resident Representative M'Hamed Rezali at 647-780-3455 so that your ticket can be cancelled.</i></p> <p>Please note that parking tickets cannot be cancelled if vehicles were parked in illegal parking spots such as in front of a fire hydrant or in no parking zones, or if they are submitted to the Inspector later than three days after receipt.</p>
	<p>Garbage & Recycling: Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them. <i>Please ensure that you label your bins with your address.</i></p>
	<p>Restoration: The construction work area will be restored with trees, shrubs, sod, seed, concrete and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed from public and private property during construction will be replaced. Lawn seeding and/or laying of sod will be done as needed during ideal growing seasons only - in the spring (April to June) and fall (September to October).</p>
