Road Rehabilitation on Carsbrooke Road and other local roads Road Reconstruction on Forestone Road

Contract: 16ECS-TI-103LR
Expected Start Date: August 29, 2016
Expected End Date: December 12, 2016

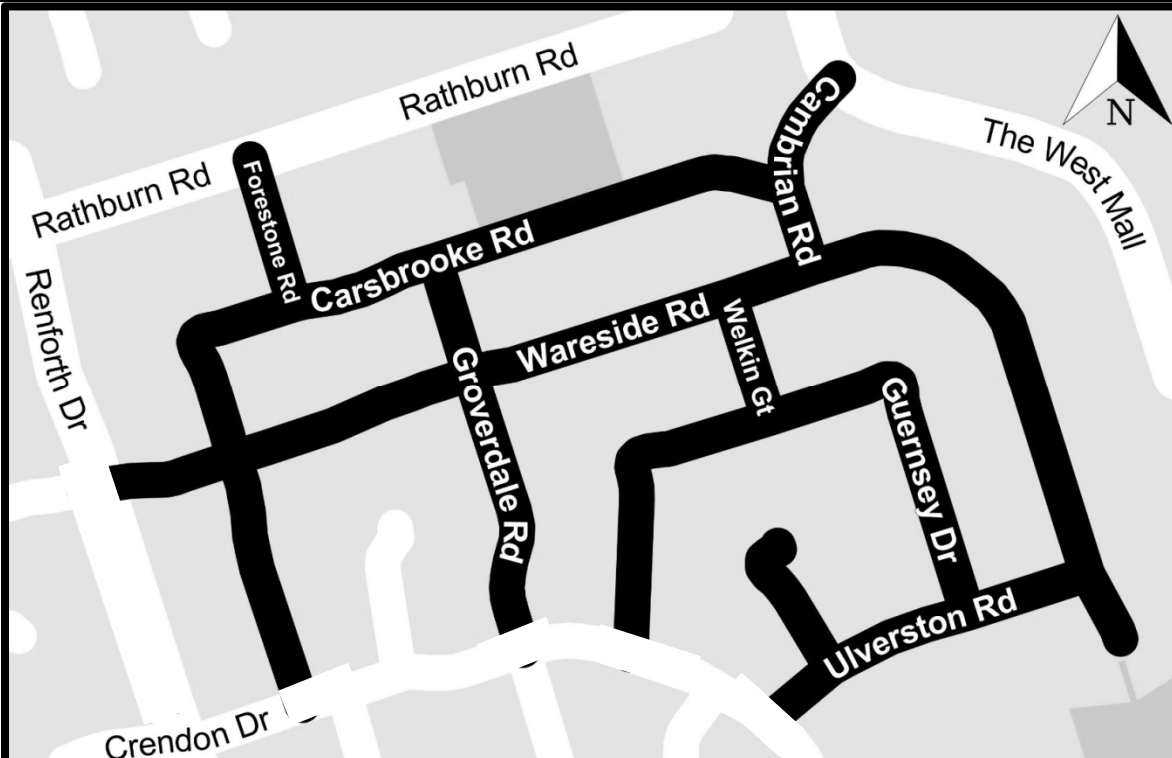
The City of Toronto will rehabilitate roads using the CIREAM (Cold In-Place Recycled Expanded Asphalt Mix) process as well as curb replacement and sidewalk repairs. The CIREAM process is an ecological method of road rehabilitation in which the existing asphalt is recycled and placed back down as the asphalt base layer. Work will take place on these streets (see map):

- Beckenham Court
- Ulverston Road,
- Wareside Road,
- Cambrian Road,
- Guernsey Drive,
- Welkin Gate,
- Groverdale Road, and;
- Carsbrooke Road.

Forestone Road is being fully reconstructed because of grading constraints that would have arisen if the CIREAM process was used there. Full road reconstruction differs from the CIREAM process in that all the existing materials of the road are removed and replaced (i.e. granular base materials and asphalt). There will also be new curb and gutter on both sides and concrete sidewalk on the east side along Forestone Road.

This work is needed to bring the road and sidewalk to a state of good repair. This project is part of the Council-approved 2016 Capital Works Program to renew aging infrastructure.

WORK DETAILS








The City's contractor will move equipment on-site and prepare the work area before construction begins. Construction crews will then:

- Remove and replace all curb and gutter and localized sidewalk where required.
- Use the CIREAM process to lay down base asphalt and place surface course asphalt, followed by surface course asphalt.

WHAT TO EXPECT BEFORE CONSTRUCTION

- You will experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce impacts. Your patience is appreciated.

- Property owners should remove items located within City property limits (boulevard or front yard), such as landscaping and / or decorative objects.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.

	<p>Work Hours: Work will take place from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.</p>
	<p>Pre-Construction Inspection: OZA Inspection Ltd., under contract to the City of Toronto, will survey all properties within 30 metres of the construction area before construction starts. Participation in the survey is voluntary; however, participating is important in determining if the construction caused damage. The inspection will look at both the interior and exterior of all properties to verify existing conditions. The company will deliver a separate notice requesting time to set up appointments. All inspection staff will be wearing photo identification and carrying photographic equipment during their work.</p>
	<p>Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.</p> <p>Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.</p>
	<p>Traffic Management: Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Road users should expect some delays.</p>
	<p>Parking: Parking in the active work zone is not permitted due to space requirements for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects the construction work, it will be re-located with no charge to the owner. If your vehicle is moved, please contact parking control for its location at 416-808-2222.</p> <p><i>In the event you receive a traffic ticket for on-street parking during this period of construction, please immediately contact Taras Pawluk (416-806-1763), so that your ticket can be cancelled.</i></p> <p>Please note that parking tickets cannot be cancelled if vehicles were parked in illegal parking spots such as in front of a fire hydrant or in no parking zones, or if they are submitted more than three days after receipt.</p>
	<p>Garbage & Recycling: Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them. <i>Please ensure that you label your bins with your address.</i></p>
	<p>Restoration: The construction work area will be restored with sod and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed from public and private property during construction will be replaced.</p>
