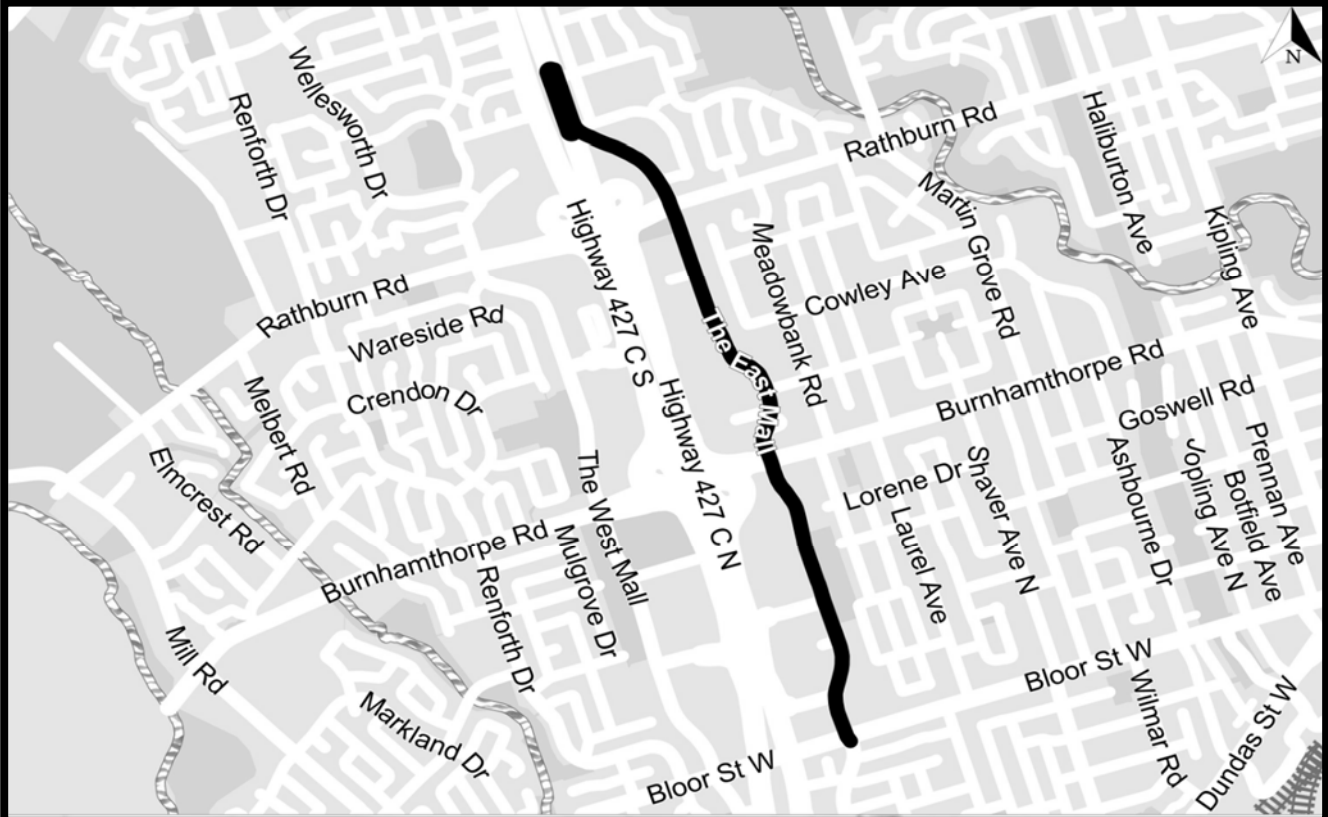
Watermain Replacement on The East Mall from Bloor St. to Burnhamthorpe Rd. and Road Resurfacing from Bloor St. to West Deane Park Rd.

Contract: 17ECS-TI-01MR
Start Date: April 4, 2017
End Date: August 31, 2017
**Timeline is subject to change.*

The City of Toronto will replace the watermain and the City-owned portion of water services on The East Mall from Bloor Street to Burnhamthorpe Road and Resurface the road from Bloor Street to West Deane Park Road. This project will also involve repairs to deficient curbs and sidewalk.

This project is part of the Council-approved 2017 Capital Works Program to renew our aging infrastructure, improve water distribution and reduce the risk watermain breaks.

WORK DETAILS

The City's contractor will:

- Excavate the road and dig a trench to access and install the new watermain
- Replace any City-owned water service pipes from the watermain to the private property line
- Restore all work areas with asphalt, when the underground works are complete
- Resurface the road and repair sidewalk and boulevard areas

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.
- Property owners should remove items located within City property limits (boulevard), such as landscaping and / or decorative objects. If you have a sprinkler system within the boulevard, please contact the Project Manager.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.

	<p>Work Hours: Work will take place from 7:00 am to 7:00 pm., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.</p>
	<p>Water Service Disruptions: From time-to-time, the water supply to your property will be shut-off to complete construction; the contractor will provide at least 24-hour advance notice. Throughout the work, it is recommended that you temporarily disconnect any water treatment systems (i.e. softeners or filters), water-cooled air conditioners or similar plumbing fixtures. Automatic lawn sprinkler systems may also be affected, therefore, you may need to shut water manually. There may be situations when an emergency water shut off could have been necessary for which you may not receive a notice.</p>
	<p>Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.</p> <p>Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.</p>
	<p>Traffic Management: Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Some of these efforts include adding Local Access signs, revising traffic signal times. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets.</p> <p>Traffic on The East Mall will be reduced to one lane in each direction.</p>
	<p>Parking: Parking in the active work zone is not permitted due to space requirements for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects the construction work, it will be re-located with no charge to the owner. If your vehicle is moved, please contact parking control for its location at 416-808-2222.</p>
	<p>Garbage & Recycling: Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them. Please ensure that you label your bins with your address.</p>
	<p>Restoration: The construction work area will be restored with sod and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed from public and private property during construction will be replaced. Lawn seeding and/or laying of sod may be done as needed during ideal growing seasons only - in the spring (April to June) and fall (September to October).</p>
