## Watermain Cleaning and Relining at the intersection of The Queensway and Highway 427 OVERNIGHT WORK

**Contract No. 16TW-OS-34CWD**  
**Expected Start Date for Overnight Work: May 22, 2017**  
**Expected Duration: 21 days**

Further to the Construction Notice you received in March, the City of Toronto is commencing work to clean and structurally reline the watermain in your area.

In order to complete the work under Highway 427, this must be done at night due to restrictions from the Ministry of Transportation. Conducting work overnight will also help to minimize traffic disruption and congestion.

### WORK DETAILS





The City’s contractor will move equipment on-site and prepare the work area before construction begins. Construction crews will then:

- Excavate the road and dig a trench to access the existing valves;
- Install a temporary water supply system and attach your building to the supply
- Clean and structurally re-line the existing watermain
- Replace any City-owned water service pipes that do not meet City standards (from the watermain to the private property line)
- Remove the temporary water supply and restore all work areas with asphalt, concrete or grass

**Please note** that crews will need to turn off the water on the night that the valves are being removed and replaced. More information on this can be found below.

### WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

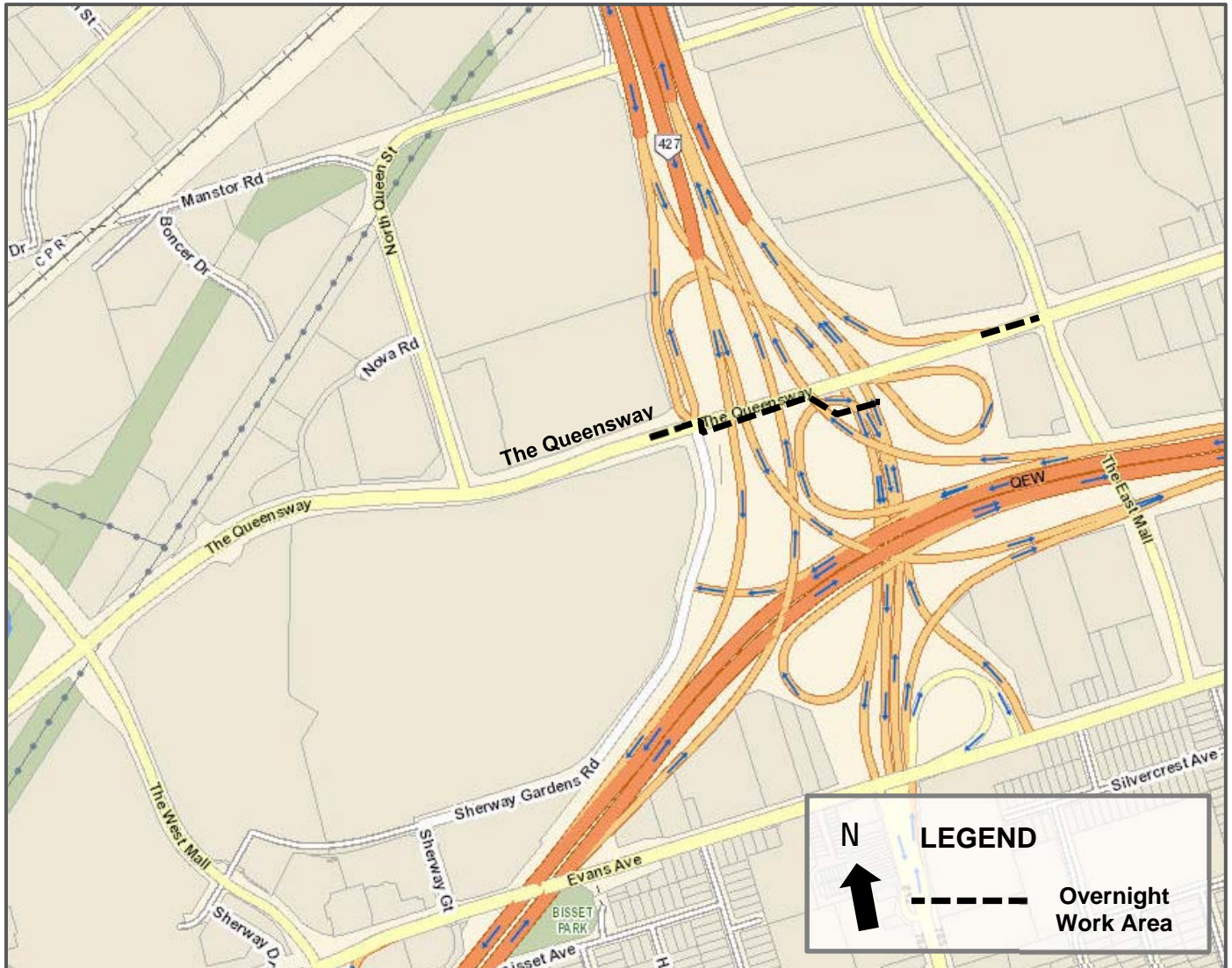
- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences during this work. The City will make every effort to reduce the impact. We appreciate your patience.

	<b>Overnight Work Hours:</b> Work will take place from 10:00 pm to 6:00 am, Monday to Friday. In case of inclement weather, the overnight work may be suspended and will resume the next evening.
	<b>Water Service Disruption:</b> The water supply to your property may need to be shut-off to complete construction; the contractor will provide at least 24-hour advance notice for all planned shut-offs. Throughout the work, it is recommended that you temporarily disconnect any water treatment systems (i.e. softeners or filters), water-cooled air conditioners or similar plumbing fixtures. Automatic lawn sprinkler systems may also be affected, therefore, you may need to water manually. In the event you did not receive advanced notice, an <b>emergency water shut off</b> could have been necessary.
	<b>Road and Sidewalk Access:</b> In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.
	<b>Traffic Management:</b> Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and pedestrians. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets.
