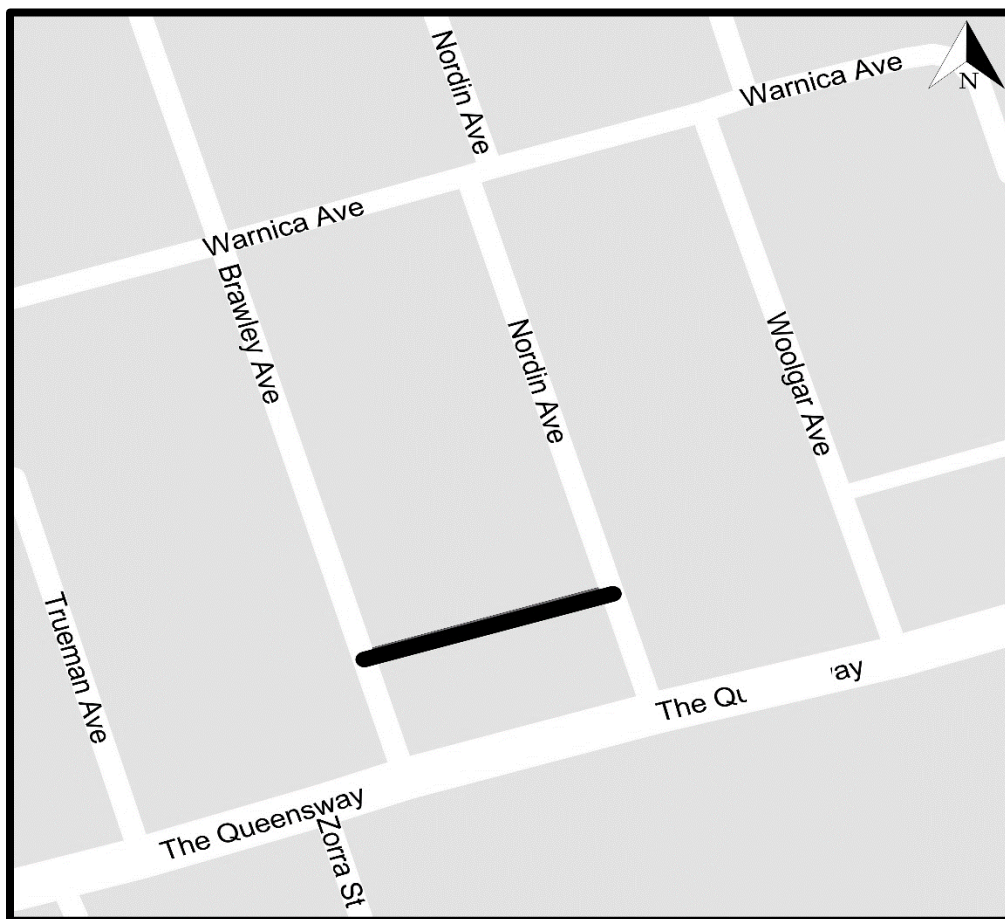

The City of Toronto will be reconstructing 65m of a laneway in your area. The laneway is located north of The Queensway and East of Brawley Avenue. Work will take place from Brawley Avenue to Nordin Avenue. Our inspection of the laneway shows that it needs reconstruction to bring it to a state of good repair.

This work is part of the Council-approved 2017 Capital Works Program to renew aging city roads and laneways for current and future needs.

WORK DETAILS

The City's contractor will:

- Remove and replace the granular base, and concrete surface along the laneway;
- Restore all work areas with asphalt, concrete or grass.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.
- Property owners should remove items located within City property limits, such as fencing or decorative objects.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.

	<p>Work Hours: Work will take place from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.</p>
	<p>Pre-Construction Inspection: Wristen’s Home Specialties Inc., under contract to the City of Toronto, will survey all properties within 30 metres of the construction area before construction starts. Participation in the survey is voluntary; however, participating is important in determining if the construction caused damage. The inspection will look at both the interior and exterior of all properties to verify existing conditions. The company will deliver a separate notice requesting time to set up appointments. All inspection staff will be wearing photo identification and carrying photographic equipment during their work.</p>
	<p>Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.</p>
	<p>Traffic Management: Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets. The laneway will be closed for approximately 20 days starting September 22.</p>
	<p>Parking: Parking in the active work zone is not permitted due to space requirements for construction equipment and materials. <u>Alternate Parking</u> will be provided for vehicles displaced from the laneway*. Please <u>contact the Field Ambassador</u> as soon as possible to provide your licence plate number and required information. *Vehicle must be registered to your address to qualify for alternate parking.</p>
	<p>Garbage & Recycling: Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them. <i>Please ensure that you label your bins with your address.</i></p>
	<p>Restoration: The construction work area will be restored with sod and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed from public and private property during construction will be replaced.</p>
