The City of Toronto will resurface The Queensway from Etobicoke Creek to Sherway Gardens Road. Our inspection of the road shows that it needs repaving and sections of damaged curb and sidewalk need to be replaced to bring them to a state of good repair.

This work is part of the Council-approved 2017 Capital Works Program to renew aging city roads and sidewalk for current and future needs.

WORK DETAILS

Work on this project will be delivered in 3 phases.

Phase	Work
<p>1 North and South sides The Queensway.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Removal of damaged sidewalk and curb • Install new sidewalk and curb in damaged areas • Top soil and sod
<p>2 North and south sides The Queensway.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Milling of pavement • Adjusting catch basins and manholes • Road base repair • Place base asphalt
<p>3 North and south sides The Queensway.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Place top asphalt • Line Marking • Clean-up

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.
- Property owners on The Queensway should remove items located within City property limits (boulevard area) such as landscaping and/or decorative objects. If you have a sprinkler system within the boulevard, please contact the Project Manager.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.

	<p>Work Hours: Work will take place from 7:00 am to 11:00 pm., Monday to Friday. There may be some weekend work, but it will not start earlier than 9:00 am.</p>
	<p>Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.</p> <p>Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.</p>
	<p>Traffic Management: Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Some of these efforts include adding Local Access signs, revising traffic signal times. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets.</p> <p>Traffic will be reduced to one lane in each direction.</p>
	<p>TTC Service: This project may affect travel times on 80 Queensway bus. Visit ttc.ca for accurate schedule information.</p>
	<p>Restoration: The construction work area will be restored with sod and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed from public and private property during construction will be replaced. Lawn seeding and/or laying of sod will be done as needed during ideal growing seasons only - in the spring (April to June) and fall (September to October).</p>
