Laneway Reconstruction south of Lake Shore Boulevard West (east of Tenth Street & east of Sixth Street)

Expected Start Date: July 2016


Expected End Date: October 2016

The City of Toronto is planning to reconstruct the laneway south of Lakeshore Boulevard West in two sections, east of Tenth Street and east of Sixth Street (see map). Our inspection of the laneway shows that it needs reconstruction to bring them to a state of good repair.

This work is part of the Council-approved 2016 Capital Works Program to renew aging city roads, lanes and sidewalk for current and future needs.

WHAT TO EXPECT BEFORE CONSTRUCTION

- Work crews will mark sidewalks and curbs requiring replacement and the locations of underground utilities, such as gas, water and cable so that the construction work does not interfere with these utilities.
- Affected properties will receive a Construction Notice approximately two weeks before work begins with more information about the work.
- Work in the boulevard in front of homes and commercial properties is expected. This work includes removing and replacing driveways, municipal sidewalks and grassed boulevards, where necessary.
- Property owners should remove items located within City property limits (boulevard), such as landscaping and or decorative objects before work starts. If you have a sprinkler system within the boulevard, please contact the Project Manager listed below.

	<p>Pre-Construction Inspection: Contractor under contract to the City of Toronto, will survey all properties within 10 metres of the construction area before construction starts. Participation in the survey is voluntary; however, participating is important in determining if the construction caused damage. The inspection will look at both the interior and exterior of all properties to verify existing conditions. The company will deliver a separate notice requesting time to set up appointments. All inspection staff will be wearing photo identification and carrying photographic equipment during their work.</p>
	<p>Accessible Accommodation: Residents who require accommodation (level entry, longer notice, etc.) must contact the Project Manager to arrange for access during the construction period.</p>
