Sanitary Sewer Rehabilitation on Fortieth Street from Brown's Line to Long Branch Pumping Station

Expected Start Date: Fall 2017

Expected End Date: Summer 2018



The City of Toronto is planning to rehabilitate the sanitary sewer and the City-owned portion of sanitary service laterals on Fortieth Street from Brown's Line to Long Branch Pumping Station on Forty Second Street.

The sanitary sewer carries sewage from bathrooms, sinks, kitchens, and other plumbing components in homes to wastewater treatment plants. The sanitary service lateral is the pipe connecting your home's plumbing to the City's sewer. These pipes are owned by you and by the City. The part that you own is from your house to the end of your property, the part the City owns goes from the sewer to your property line.

This project is part of the Council-approved 2017 Capital Works Program to improve water distribution and renew aging infrastructure reducing the risk of sewer collapse or blockages that cause sewer backups.

WHAT TO EXPECT BEFORE CONSTRUCTION

- Work crews will mark the locations of underground utilities, such as gas, water and cable so that the construction work does not interfere with these utilities.
- Affected properties will receive a Construction Notice approximately two weeks before work begins with more information about the work. Construction will start in September-2017 and will be completed by the Summer of 2018

- Work in the boulevard in front of homes and commercial properties is expected. This work includes removing and replacing driveways, municipal sidewalks and grassed boulevards, where necessary.
- The City will rehabilitate the City-owned portion of the service lateral along Fortieth Street.
- Property owners should remove items located within City property limits (boulevard), such as landscaping and or decorative objects before work starts. If you have a sprinkler system within the boulevard, please contact the Project Manager listed below. When the contractor will rehabilitate your sanitary service lateral rehabilitated, you will be provided a specific notice requesting you to minimize water usage for that day.
- Rehabilitating a sewer is primarily trenchless and major excavation is not anticipated. A temporary bypass pumping system with temporary pipes will be installed so that sewer flow can be maintained while crews rehabilitate the sewer.

	<p>Accommodation: Residents who require accommodation (level entry, longer notice, etc.) must contact the Project Manager to arrange for access during the construction period.</p>
	<p>Access to Your Home: The City-hired contractor may need access to your home to complete a pre-construction survey. Affected properties will receive a pre-construction survey request to schedule a time to complete the survey.</p>
