## Road Resurfacing & Sidewalk Construction on Kipling Avenue from Lakeshore Boulevard to Evans Avenue

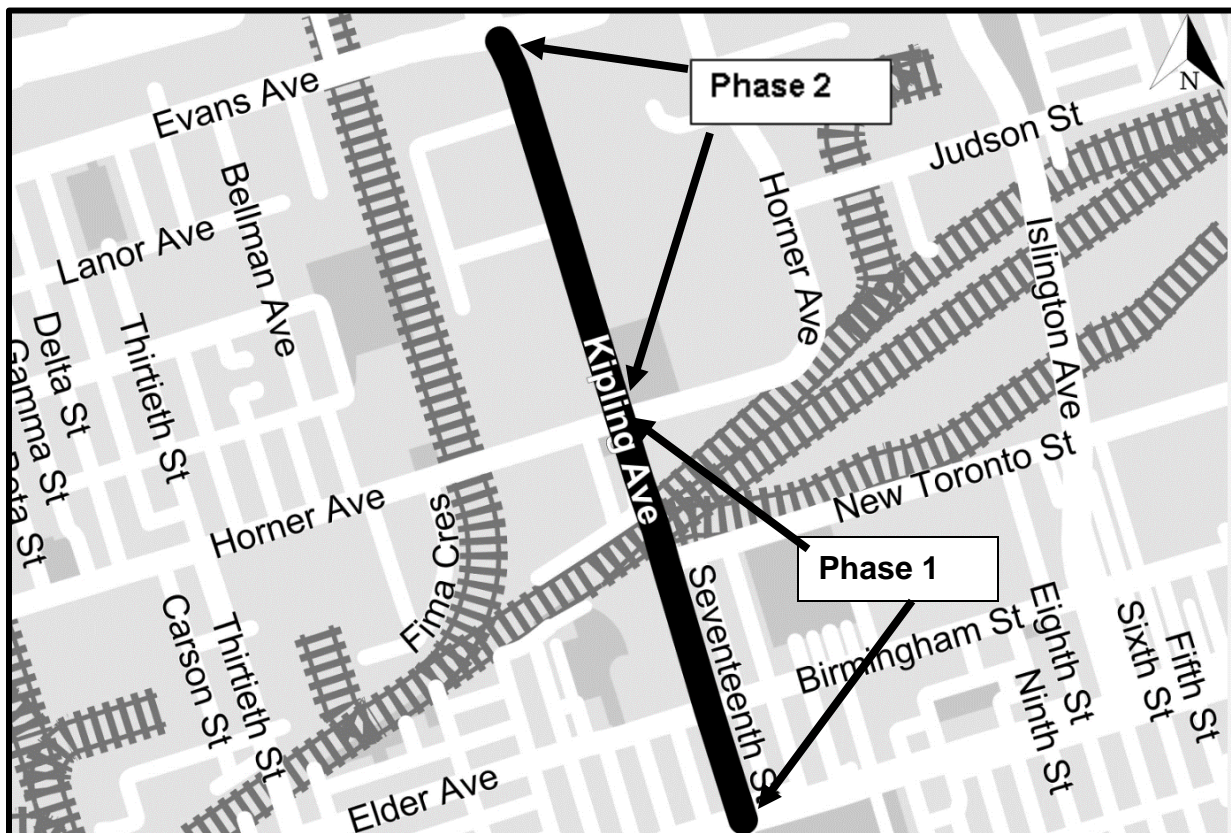

The City of Toronto is resurfacing Kipling Avenue from Lakeshore Boulevard to Evans Avenue. Our inspection of the road shows that it needs repaving and sections of damaged curb and sidewalk need to be replaced to bring them to a state of good repair.

In addition, a new sidewalk will be constructed on the east side of Kipling Avenue from Torlake Crescent (south leg) to Evans Avenue.

This work is part of the Council-approved 2017 Capital Works Program to renew aging city roads and sidewalk for current and future needs.

### WORK DETAILS

The City's contractor will:

- Dig up and replace deficient sidewalks and curbs
- Mill the road surface
- Re-align maintenance holes and catch basins
- Repave the road surface

**Work will take place in 2 phases:**

**Phase 1:** between Horner Avenue and Lakeshore Boulevard

**Phase 2:** between Horner Avenue and Evans Avenue

## WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.
- Property owners should remove items located within City property limits, such as landscaping and/or decorative objects. If you have a sprinkler system within the boulevard, please contact the Project Manager.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.

	<p><b>Work Hours:</b> Work will take place from 7:00 am to 7:00 pm., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required. Milling and Paving of Kipling Ave between Horner Ave and Evans Ave may occur overnight to minimize the impact to industrial operations of nearby businesses</p>
	<p><b>Road and Sidewalk Access:</b> In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.</p> <p><b>Driveway Access:</b> The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.</p>
	<p><b>Traffic Management:</b> Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Some of these efforts include adding Local Access signs, revising traffic signal times. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets.</p> <p><b>Traffic on Kipling Ave will be reduced to one lane in each direction.</b></p>
	<p><b>Parking:</b> Parking in the active work zone is not permitted due to space requirements for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects the construction work, it will be re-located with no charge to the owner. If your vehicle is moved, please contact parking control for its location at <b>416-808-2222</b>.</p>
	<p><b>Transit Service Impacts:</b> This project may affect travel times for the <b>44 Kipling South</b> and <b>188 Kipling South Rocket</b>. Visit <a href="http://ttc.ca">ttc.ca</a> for further service details.</p>
	<p><b>Garbage &amp; Recycling:</b> Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them. <b>Please ensure that you label your bins with your address.</b></p>
	<p><b>Restoration:</b> The construction work area will be restored with sod and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed from public and private property during construction will be replaced. Lawn seeding and/or laying of sod may be done as needed during ideal growing seasons only - in the spring (April to June) and fall (September to October).</p>
