## Storm Sewer Replacement on Dundas Street West from East Side of Humber Bridge Descending Along Ravine Embankment to Outfall on Humber River

**Contract: 15ECS-LU-01SM**

**Start Date: February 2016**

**End Date: June 2017**



The City of Toronto will replace the storm sewer on Dundas Street West from the east side of the Humber River Bridge descending along the ravine embankment to the existing outfall on the Humber River starting in February 2016.

The storm sewer is an underground pipe designed to collect stormwater and melting snow and release the run-off at the existing outfall into the Humber River.

This project is part of the Council-approved 2016 Capital Works Program that will improve stormwater conveyance and the City's aging infrastructure.

### WORK DETAILS

In the first few weeks, the City's contractor will move equipment on-site and prepare the work area before construction begins. Construction crews will then:

- Excavate a trench about 20m long on Dundas Street West and 75m long descending along the bridge embankment and ravine slope for replacement of the storm sewer.
- Replace existing and construct new retaining walls for stabilization of the bridge embankment and ravine slope.
- Restore all work areas with asphalt, concrete and landscape plantings.

## WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.

	<p><b>Work Hours:</b> Work will take place from 7:00 am to 7:00 pm., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.</p>
	<p><b>Road and Sidewalk Access:</b> In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.</p> <p><b>Driveway Access:</b> For residents in the vicinity of 4070 Old Dundas Street, the contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.</p>
	<p><b>Traffic Management:</b> Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Some of these efforts include adding Local Access signs, revising traffic signal times. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets.</p> <p><b>Traffic on Dundas Street West on the east side of the Humber River Bridge will be reduced from four to two lanes.</b></p>
	<p><b>Restoration:</b> The construction work area will be restored with landscaping and/or asphalt where required. Landscaping, seeding and/or laying of sod will be done as needed during ideal growing seasons only - in the spring (April to June) and fall (September to October).</p>
