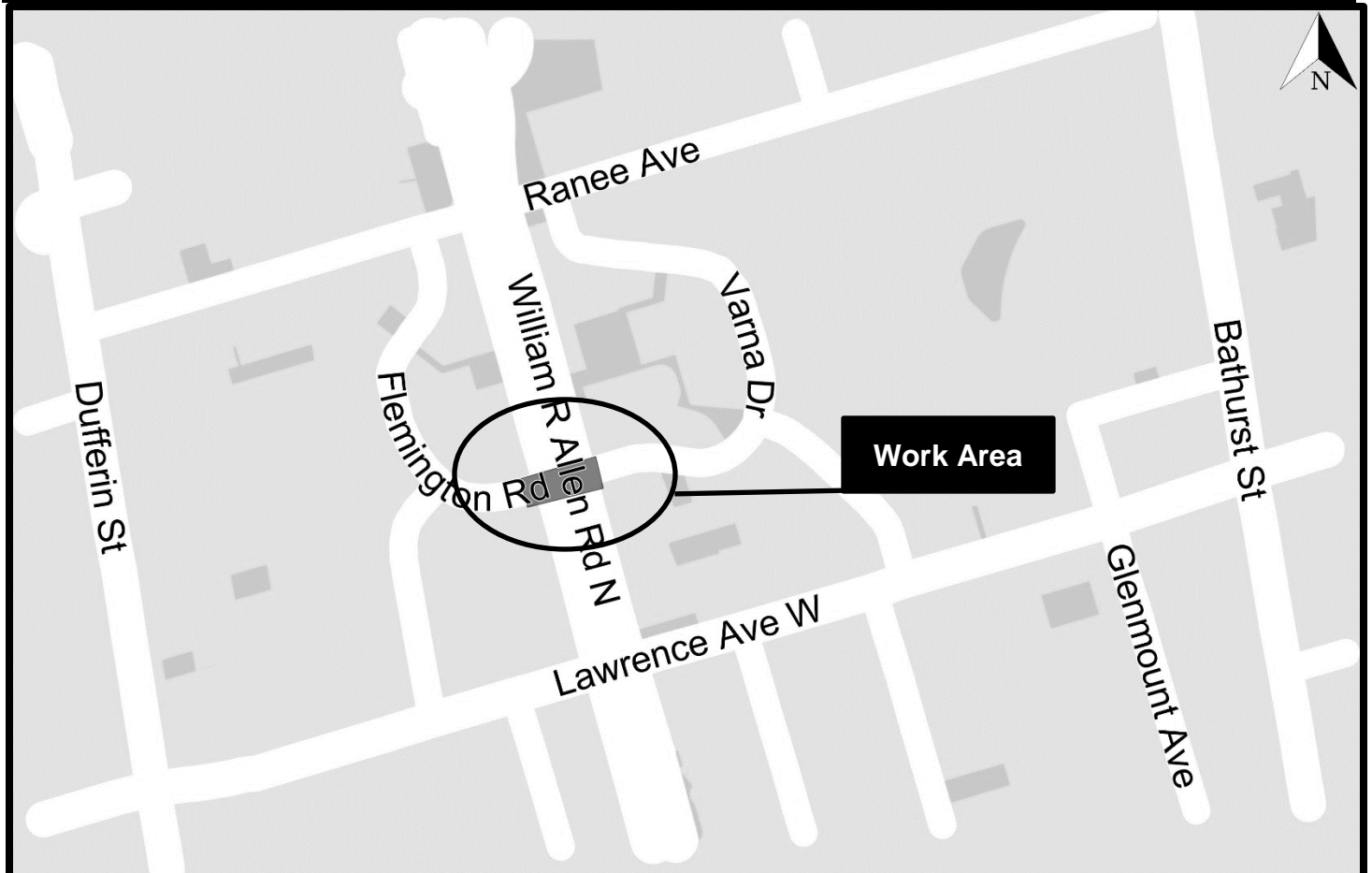

This work will ensure that the bridge meets today's standards and remains safe for vehicles and pedestrians into the future.

WORK DETAILS

The contractor will




- Repair areas of deteriorated concrete on the underside of the bridge
- Install Carbon Fiber Reinforced Polymer (CFRP) reinforcing/strengthening strips on the girders

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce impacts. We appreciate your patience.



Work Hours: Work on this project will take place from 10:00 p.m. to 5:00 a.m., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.

	<p>Sidewalk Access: Access on Flemington Road may be limited some nights when access to the underside of the bridge is provided via machinery parked on Flemington. All work will occur during off-peak hours.</p>
	<p>Traffic Management: Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. W. R. Allen Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • W. R. Allen Road will be reduced to one lane in each direction nightly from May to July. • The W. R Allen Road southbound off-ramp to Lawrence Avenue may have short duration lane reductions and/or closure during off-peak hours from May to July. • The northbound on-ramp from Lawrence Avenue to W.R. Allen Road may have short duration closures during off-peak hours from May to July. • On nights when access to the underside of the bridge is provided using machinery parked on Flemington there will be lane reductions and diversions, but one lane will be maintained in each direction.
	<p>Restoration: Areas affected by construction will be restored.</p>
