Watermain Replacement on Bathurst Street and Eireann Quay

Contract: 16ECS-LU-03SU

Start Date: September 6, 2016

Expected End Date: April 30, 2017*

**Timeline is subject to change.*

The City of Toronto's work to replace the watermain and the City-owned portion of substandard water services on Eireann Quay and on Bathurst from Lakeshore Boulevard to Queens Quay continues.

There was a short break in the Watermain replacement over the holidays. Work resumes on January 16th to complete the portions of work that can be performed in the winter. The remainder of underground work and restoration will be completed in the spring. Please see the schedule summary below for further information.

We appreciate your patience while we continue to work on watermain replacement.

WORK DETAILS

To date, the following work has been completed:

- The watermain has been installed on Eireann Quay
- most of the watermain on Bathurst Street has been installed





The following work will be completed in the coming weeks:

- The contractor will install the rest of the watermain on Bathurst Street. This is anticipated to take one week, and is weather dependent.
- When the watermain is installed it will be disinfected and tested. This process will take 1 to 2 weeks depending on water sample test results. There will be little-to-no construction during this time.
- Once the watermain has passed testing, water services will be transferred from the old main to the new main. This process involves localized work at each property. While a property's service is being transferred, water service to that property will be temporarily shut off. Notice will be provided in advance of any planned shut-offs.

Work scheduled for the spring:

- The final portion of watermain work involves installing the new main across the Queens Quay intersection.
- Crews will also complete sidewalk repairs and complete the repair affected sections of the road.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

	<p>Work Hours: Most work will take place from 10:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m. Monday night to Friday night with some work during the day on weekends as required (9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.).</p> <p>Overnight work allows the road to remain open and free of work during the day and reduces the interruption to TTC Streetcar service in the community.</p>
	<p>Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.</p> <p>Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.</p>
	<p>Traffic Management: Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents.</p> <p>As a part of this work, southbound lanes on Bathurst will typically be closed from Lake Shore Boulevard West to Queens Quay, from 10:00pm to 6:00 am, Monday night to Friday night.</p>
	<p>Parking: Parking in the active work zone is not permitted due to space requirements for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects the construction work, it will be re-located with no charge to the owner. If your vehicle is moved, please contact parking control for its location at 416-808-2222.</p>
