## Watermain Replacement on Bedford Road from Macpherson Avenue to Bernard Avenue

**Contract: 15ECS-LU-01TT**

**Start Date: February 2016**

**End Date: February 2017**

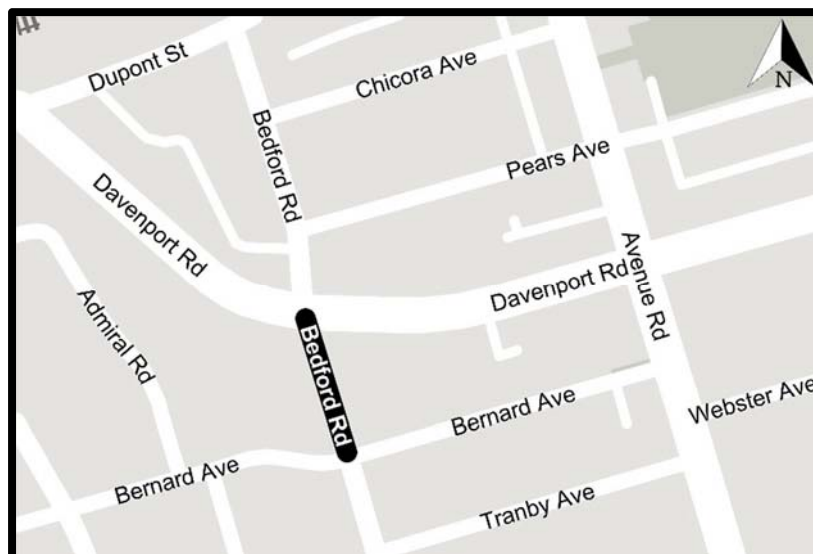
The City of Toronto is replacing and re-lining the watermain on Bedford Road between Bernard Avenue and Macpherson Avenue (See map on page 4) and the construction work is currently occurring near the intersection of Bernard Avenue and Bedford Road.

Majority of the project is to be completed using tunneling method. This method will reduce the impact to residents and businesses along the route as excavation will be limited to few places.

This notice is to inform the residents of an upcoming lane closure on Bedford Road between Bernard Avenue and Davenport Road. Bedford Road will be reduced to a single northbound lane between Bernard Avenue and Davenport Road for vehicular traffic from June 27, 2016 to October 21, 2016. An excavation pit will be constructed near Bernard Road and Bedford Road intersection to commence tunneling to install the watermain, which requires closure of one lane due to large size of the pit and to permit machinery and material hauling trucks.

**The Northbound lane on Bedford Road between Bernard Avenue and Davenport Avenue will remain open at all times, but the southbound lane will be closed from June 27, 2016 to December 31, 2016.** Temporary detour signs will be installed at a few locations advising residents of alternate routes.

To date the following work has been completed:

### Macpherson Avenue – Dupont Street

Re-lining for the northernmost section of the watermain from Macpherson Avenue to Dupont Street runs under the railway tracks has completed.

## WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.

	<p><b>Road and Sidewalk Access:</b> In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.</p> <p><b>Driveway Access:</b> The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.</p>
	<p><b>Parking:</b> If your vehicle is moved, please contact parking control for its location at <b>416-808-2222</b>. <i><b>In the event you receive a traffic ticket for on-street parking during this period of construction, please immediately contact the Inspector Mahir Begovic at 647-230-5186, so that your ticket can be cancelled.</b></i> Please note that parking tickets cannot be cancelled if vehicles were parked in illegal parking spots such as in front of a fire hydrant or in no parking zones, or if they are submitted to the <b>Inspector</b> later than <b>three days</b> after receipt.</p>
	<p><b>Traffic Management:</b> Road users should expect delays near key areas. <b>Traffic on Bedford Road from Davenport to Bernard will be limited to northbound travel only.</b></p>
	<p><b>TTC Service:</b> TTC has adjusted service of the 26 Dupont Street Bus. Visit <a href="http://ttc.ca">ttc.ca</a> for accurate schedule information.</p>
