Hogg's Hollow – Phase 4 Stormwater Management and Road Improvements

Expected Project Start Date: March 2015
Expected Completion Date: August 2015

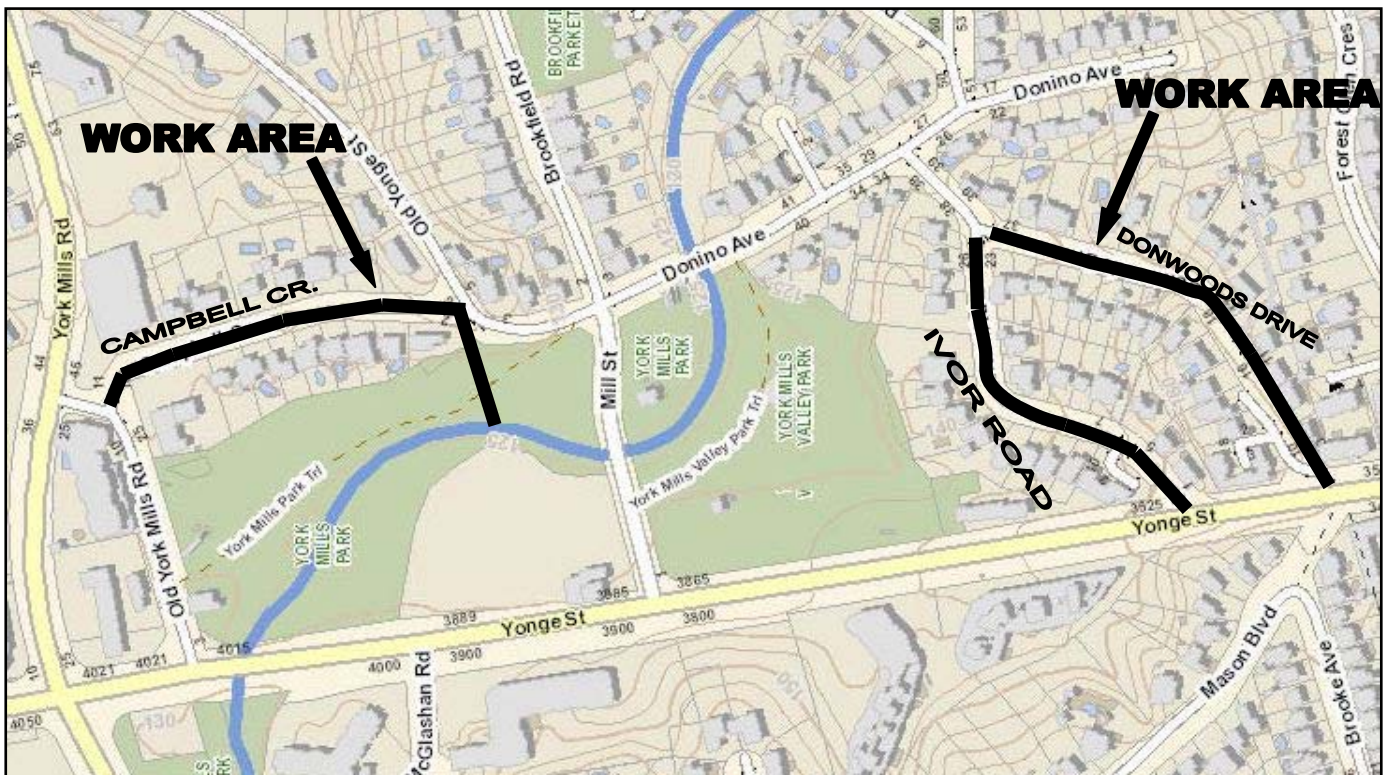
The City of Toronto will install storm sewers and reconstruct roads, curbs and gutters in order to improve roads and stormwater management in your area. This project will also involve replacing some watermains and the City-owned portion of any substandard water service in order to ensure continued safe and efficient delivery of water and to improve the water distribution system and drinking water quality. This work is the result of the Hogg's Hollow Stormwater Management and Road Improvement Environmental Assessment, completed in 2005.

This work will take place on the following streets:

- Donwoods Drive from Yonge Street to Ivor Road
- Ivor Road from Yonge Street to Donwoods Drive
- Campbell Crescent from Old York Mills Road to Old Yonge Street

Your co-operation and patience during the construction period is crucial and appreciated.

Construction Details

The construction work on Donwoods Drive, Ivor Road, and Campbell Crescent includes:

- Constructing a new storm sewer
- Replacing Substandard City-owned portions of the water service
- Road reconstruction with curbs and restoration of driveways, where required.

You will be notified if there are any significant changes to the planned construction schedule or work.

Work Hours

Work will typically take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. from Monday to Friday with work after hours and weekends, as required.

Disruptions

As with all construction projects, there will be noise, dust and temporary inconveniences. In order to complete the work effectively and in a safe manner, some pedestrian and traffic restrictions will be necessary. These include temporary road closures and on-street parking changes. The contractor will further notify you of any temporary disruptions. Every effort will be made to reduce the inconvenience. The City appreciates your understanding and cooperation.

Parking Restrictions & Allowances

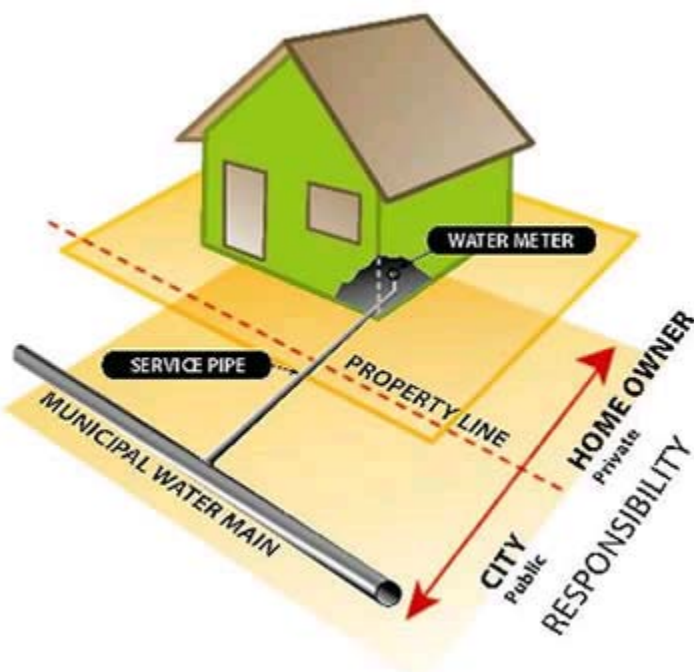
Construction will also require temporary closure of private driveways. Where a property has two entrances, every effort will be made to keep one entrance open at all times. Further notice will be given prior to temporary closures.

Boulevard Work

Residents are advised that private installations such as planted landscaping, irrigation systems, and/or lighting features that are located within City property may be in conflict with the construction process. To avoid unnecessary damage to private installations, owners in the affected area may remove any privately owned items from the boulevard at their own cost prior to construction. The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items installed on the City's property or within the road allowance.

After construction is complete, any damaged caused to grassy areas will be replaced with new sod.

Every effort will be made to keep inconvenience to property owners to a minimum during the construction period, and all residents are requested to adhere to the necessary parking restrictions that will be communicated to them to facilitate completion of the works.



Substandard Water Service Replacement

A water service is the pipe that connects your house to the City's water distribution system to deliver water into your home. There are two portions to the water service – the privately-owned portion and the publicly-owned portion.

The privately-owned portion runs from the property line to the home and is owned by the property owner; the City-owned portion runs from the property line to the watermain and is owned by the City.

The City will replace the City-owned portion of any substandard

water service connection discovered during construction. The City is not responsible for replacing the privately-owned portion of the water service.

Your water service may be considered substandard if:

- the water service is made of lead or galvanized metal
- the water service is smaller than the City's 19mm standard size
- it is a double service, delivering water to more than one residential property, or
- it is leaking or broken.

If you are considering replacing the privately-owned section of the service, it is recommended that you obtain at least three quotes from licensed contractors before deciding which company to hire. Property owners may contact the same contractor retained by the City (see below) to obtain an estimate for replacing the private portion of the water service at the same time as the public portion. **PLEASE NOTE:** any contract entered into is between the home owner and the contractor.

Please take the time to read the attached fact sheet carefully as it contains important information on replacement of lead pipes and potential health concerns.

Pre-construction and Post-construction Survey

The contractor, Clearway Construction Inc., will complete pre- and post-construction surveys through dBA Environmental Services Inc.

The survey is on a voluntary basis; however, participating in the survey is important in determining if damage was caused during construction. The survey will include an inspection of both the interior and exterior of all properties to verify existing conditions. The company will deliver a separate notice requesting to set up survey appointments. All inspection staff will be wearing photo identification and carrying photographic equipment during the survey.
