## Road Resurfacing on Yonge Street from York Mills Road / Wilson Avenue to South of Highway 401

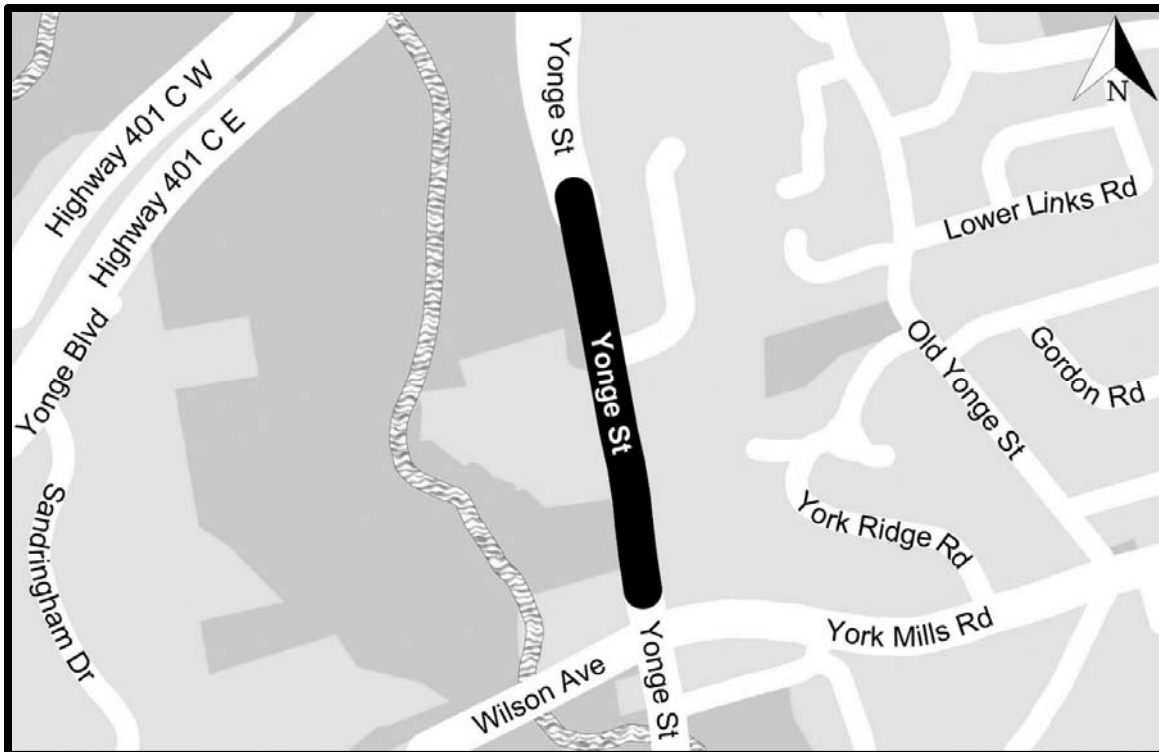
**Contract: 16ECS-TI-09SP**  
**Start Date: September 6, 2016**  
**End Date: November 30 2016**

The City of Toronto will resurface the road on Yonge Street from north of York Mills Rd/ Wilson Ave to south of Highway 401. Our inspection of the road shows that it needs resurfacing and sections of damaged curb and sidewalk will be replaced to bring them to a state of good repair.

This work is part of the Council-approved 2016 Capital Works Program to renew aging city roads and sidewalk for current and future needs.

### WORK DETAILS

The City's contractor will move equipment on-site and prepare the work area before construction begins. Construction crews will then:

- Dig up the road surface
- Re-align maintenance holes and catch basins
- Repair curbs, gutters and driveways
- Repave the road surface

### WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.
- Property owners should remove items located within City property limits (boulevard), such as landscaping and/or decorative objects. If you have a sprinkler system within the boulevard, please contact the Project Manager.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.

	<p><b>Work Hours:</b> Work will take place from <b>7:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m. Sunday night to Friday night</b> with work during the day on weekends as required.</p> <p>Overnight work reduces traffic impacts by allowing the road to remain open and free of work during the day.</p>
	<p><b>Road and Sidewalk Access:</b> In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.</p> <p><b>Driveway Access:</b> The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.</p>
	<p><b>Traffic Management:</b> Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets.</p> <p><b>In some stages of the work, traffic on Yonge Street will be reduced to one lane. Lanes on Yonge Street will be re-opened during the day on weekdays.</b></p>
	<p><b>Parking:</b> Parking in the active work zone is not permitted due to space requirements for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects the construction work, it will be re-located with no charge to the owner. If your vehicle is moved, please contact parking control for its location at <b>416-808-2222</b>.</p>
	<p><b>Garbage &amp; Recycling:</b> Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them. <b><i>Please ensure that you label your bins with your address.</i></b></p>
	<p><b>Restoration:</b> The construction work area will be restored with sod and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed from public and private property during construction will be replaced.</p>
