## Road Reconstruction on New Street from Davenport Road to West End

**Expected Start Date: September 2016**

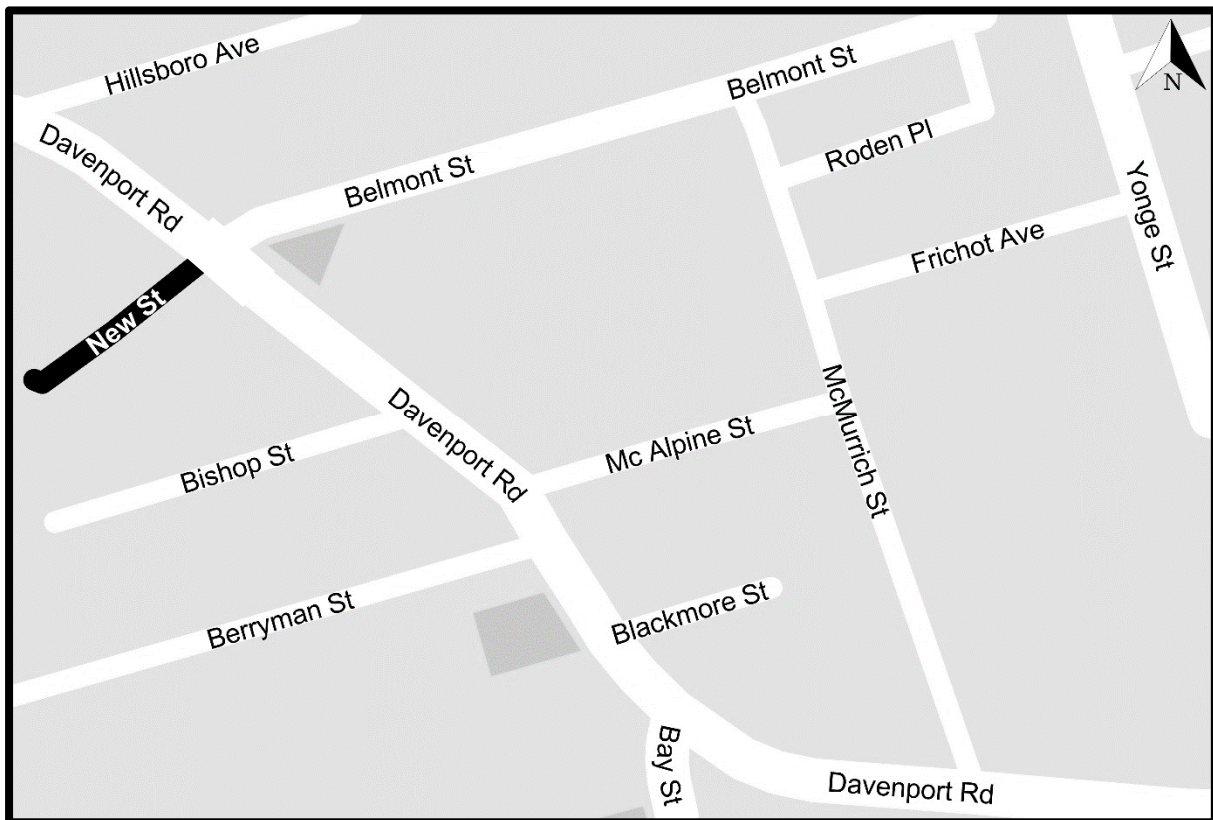
**Expected End Date: November 30, 2016**

The City of Toronto is planning to reconstruct New Street from Davenport Road to the West End (62m). Our inspection of the road shows that it needs reconstruction and sections of damaged curb and sidewalk need to be replaced to bring them to a state of good repair.

This project is part of the Council-approved 2016 Capital Works Program to renew aging city roads for current and future needs.

## WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.
- Work crews will mark the areas of the roadway that require replacement and the locations of underground utilities, such as gas, water and cable so that the construction work does not interfere with these utilities.
- Property owners should remove items located within City property limits in the laneway, such as landscaping and or decorative objects before work starts. If you have any questions about the work, please contact the Field Ambassador listed below.
- Affected properties will receive a Construction Notice approximately two weeks before work begins with more information about the work.



**Accessible Accommodation:** Residents who require accommodation (level entry, longer notice, etc.) must contact the **Field Ambassador** to arrange for access during the construction period.
