
Roadway Trench Restoration on Shuter Street From Church Street to Sherbourne Street

Expected Start Date: April 18, 2017

In 2016, the City completed most of the work associated with installing a new watermain and replacing substandard water service connections on Shuter Street between Church and Sherbourne Street. With this work completed, the Contractor needs to return to restore the trench areas roadway and sidewalk areas that were not permanently restored when work was completed.

We know this project had an impact to all businesses and residents along Shuter Street. We appreciated your patience as the project ran into delays last year. Majority of the work was completed in 2016 in April the Contractor will return to restore the trench areas in the road between Church and Sherbourne Street.

REMAINING WORK

In April, the asphalt plants will re-open and the Contractor for Shuter Street will return to permanently restore the trench that was used to restore the watermain. The contractor will not be resurfacing from curb to curb.

- Pavement restorations between Church Street to Sherbourne Street
- Concrete road base repairs in isolated areas between these limits
- Removal and replacement of sidewalk affected by watermain construction
- Minor road work between Yonge Street and Church Street in isolated areas

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.
- Property owners should remove items located within City property limits (boulevard), such as landscaping and / or decorative objects. If you have a sprinkler system within the boulevard, please contact the Project Manager.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.

	<p>Work Hours: The contractor will complete most work Monday to Saturday, 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m., with work after hours/overnight and on Sundays as required.</p>
	<p>Traffic Management: Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets.</p> <p><u>From Church Street to Sherbourne Street</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • One lane in each direction will be available on Shuter Street
	<p>Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.</p> <p>Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.</p>
	<p>Pedestrians: Will face crossing restrictions at Yonge and Shuter Streets. Please abide by the signs and follow the directions of paid duty officers working at the intersection. Construction fencing in areas east of Church Street have affected the sidewalk with, <i>please use caution on the north sidewalk.</i></p>
	<p>Cyclists: If travelling on Shuter Street, please share the traffic lane in the active work zones.</p>
	<p>Parking: Parking in the active work zone is not permitted due to space requirements for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects the construction work, it will be re-located with no charge to the owner. If your vehicle is moved, please contact parking control for its location at 416-808-2222.</p>
	<p>Garbage & Recycling: Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them. <i>Please ensure that you label your bins with your address.</i></p>
