Laneway Reconstruction From Rushbrooke Avenue to Berkshire Avenue And South to Eastern Avenue

Expected Start Date: November 1, 2016


Expected End Date: November 30, 2016

The City of Toronto is planning laneway reconstruction on two laneways from Rushbrooke Avenue to Berkshire Avenue and south to Eastern Avenue (south of Queen Street East and north of Eastern Avenue).

This project is part of the Council-approved 2016 Capital Works Program to renew aging city laneways for current and future needs.

WORK DETAILS

The City's contractor will move equipment on-site and prepare the work area before construction begins. Construction crews will then:

- Remove the existing concrete and granular base and replace with new granular base and concrete.
- Restore all areas affected by work (asphalt, concrete, grass, etc.)

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You will experience dust, noise and other inconveniences.
- Property owners should remove items located within City property limits, such as landscaping and / or decorative objects.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.
- The City will make efforts to reduce impacts. Your patience is appreciated.

	<p>Work Hours: Work will take place from 7:00 am to 7:00 pm., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.</p>
	<p>Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.</p>
	<p>Traffic Management: Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents.</p> <p>The laneway reconstruction will take approximately 31 days. The construction will start on the north south laneway at the north end and progress southerly. The east west laneway reconstruction will follow.</p> <p>The contractor will reopen the completed sections of laneway as the concrete cures and work is completed.</p>
	<p>Parking: Parking in the active work zone is not permitted due to space requirements for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects the construction work, it will be re-located with no charge to the owner. If your vehicle is moved, please contact parking control for its location at 416-808-2222.</p> <p>Temporary Parking Permits: If the active work zone blocks your garage or the location of your primary resident parking, the City will attempt to provide a temporary parking permit. This permit will be delivered to you based on availability.</p> <p>NOTE: In the event that a temporary parking permit is not issued, please arrange for an alternative parking location.</p>
	<p>Garbage & Recycling: Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them. <i>Please ensure that you label your bins with your address.</i></p>
	<p>Accessible Accommodation: Residents who require accommodation (level entry, longer notice, etc.) must contact the Field Ambassador to arrange for access during the construction period.</p>
