Watermain Relining on Lake Shore Boulevard East From Leslie Street to Woodbine Avenue

Expected Start Date: Fall 2016

Expected End Date: Spring 2017

**Timeline is subject to change. Future notice to be provided.*

The City of Toronto will be cleaning and structurally re-lining the watermain in your area this Fall. During this process, the City will also replace the City-owned portion of any substandard water service pipes.

A map of the work area can be found on page 3 of this notice.

The water service is the underground pipe that brings water from the watermain to your water meter and is owned by you and by the City. The part that the City owns runs from the watermain on the street to your property line. The part that you own runs from your property line into your home.



This project is part of the Council-approved 2016 Capital Works Program to renew our aging infrastructure, improve water distribution and reduce the risk of watermain breaks.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT LEAD WATER SERVICES

If you live in a house that was built before the mid-1950s, your water service may be made of lead. Please read the attached fact sheet with important information about the risks of lead in drinking water, especially if someone in your house is pregnant, there are children under six years old, or there is an infant drinking formula made from tap water.

WHAT TO EXPECT BEFORE CONSTRUCTION

- Work crews will mark the locations of underground utilities, such as gas, water and cable so that the construction work does not interfere with these utilities.
- Affected properties will receive a Construction Notice approximately two weeks before work begins with more information about the work, including exact details regarding the project's start and end dates.
- Work in the boulevard in front of homes and commercial properties is expected. This work includes removing and replacing a portion of driveways, municipal sidewalks and grassed boulevards, where necessary.
- Property owners should remove items located within City property limits (boulevard), such as landscaping and or decorative objects before work starts. If you have a sprinkler system within the boulevard, please contact the Field Ambassador listed on the next page.

	<p>Substandard Water Service Replacement: Please read the attached fact sheet as it contains important information about lead in drinking water and water service replacement. Find out if your water service is lead – a licensed plumber can help you with this. If it is lead, the City of Toronto encourages you to replace it. We recommend you obtain several quotes and you can contact the City's contractor for one of your quotes. Approximately two weeks prior to construction, you will receive a "Construction Notice" with the name and phone number of the City contractor. Learn more at toronto.ca/leadpipes</p>
