Road Resurfacing on Lakeshore Boulevard East and Woodbine Avenue from Leslie Street to Queen Street East

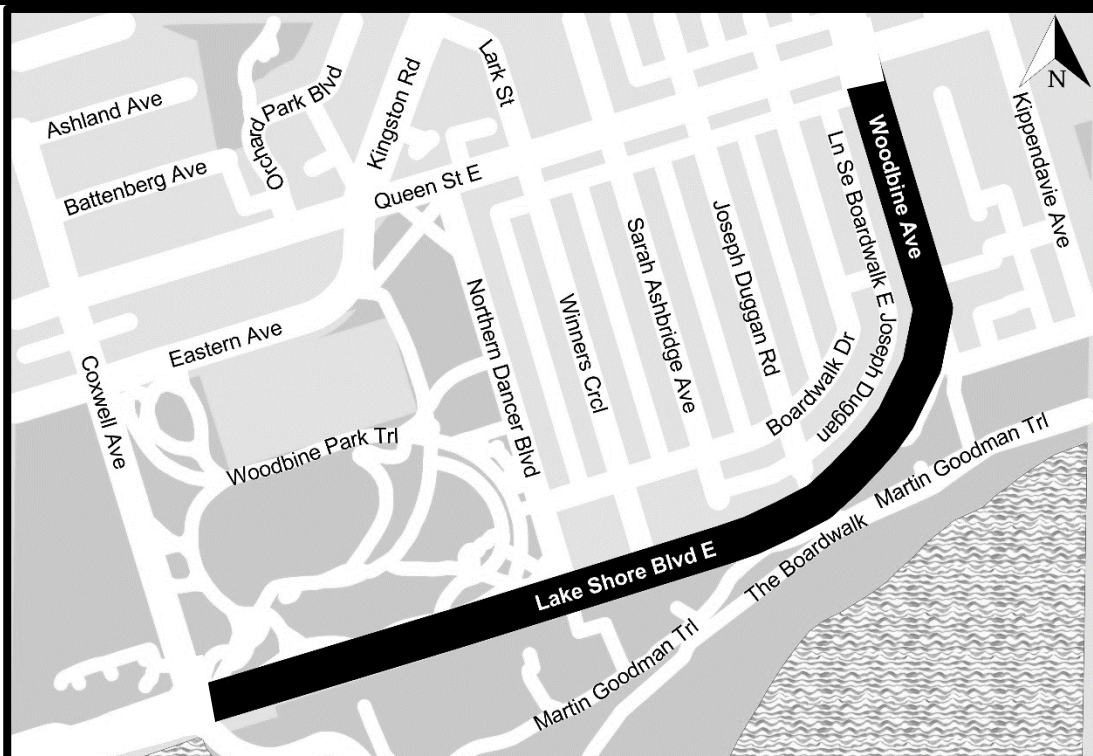

The City of Toronto's resurfacing work on Lake Shore Boulevard East from Leslie Street to Woodbine Avenue and Woodbine Avenue from Lake Shore Boulevard East to Queen Street East is progressing well.

We appreciate everyone's patience while this work progresses. The contractor has provided an early completion date of June 30, 2017. In order to complete the work according to the new schedule and due to the turn of the road at Woodbine, the contractor will work overnight on May 24, 25 and 26 if work is affected by weather on May 25.

	<p>Work Hours:</p> <p>On May 24, and 25 work will take place 24 hours a day for two days.</p> <p>All other work will take place from 7:00 am to 11:00 pm., Monday to Saturday, with work after hours and on Sundays as required.</p>
	<p>Traffic Management: Traffic lanes on</p> <p>OVERNIGHT CLOSURE from 7:00 PM to 6:00 AM on Wednesday, May 24 and Thursday, May 25</p> <p>All lanes on Lakeshore Boulevard East and Woodbine Avenue from Queen Street East to Northern Dancer Boulevard will be fully closed (see map).</p> <p>One lane of traffic in each direction will re-open from 6:00 AM to 7:00PM Thursday, May 25 and Friday, May 26.</p> <p>Traffic lanes on Queen street East will not be impacted. One lane in each direction will be maintained at other times.</p>

WORK DETAILS

Crews have replaced the concrete and sidewalks in need of replacement. The remaining work involves:

- Removing the asphalt on the road
- Re-aligning maintenance holes and catch basins
- Repaving the road surface

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.
- Property owners should remove items located within City property limits (boulevard), such as landscaping and/or decorative objects. If you have a sprinkler system within the boulevard, please contact the Project Manager.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.

	<p>Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.</p> <p>Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.</p>
	<p>Parking: Parking in the active work zone is not permitted due to space requirements for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects the construction work, it will be re-located with no charge to the owner. If your vehicle is moved, please contact parking control for its location at 416-808-2222.</p>
	<p>Garbage & Recycling: Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them. <i>Please ensure that you label your bins with your address.</i></p>
	<p>Restoration: The construction work area will be restored with sod and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed from public and private property during construction will be replaced. Lawn seeding and/or laying of sod will be done as needed during ideal growing seasons only - in the spring (April to June) and fall (September to October).</p>
