## Road Resurfacing on Pharmacy Avenue From Ellesmere Road to CPR Bridge (north side)

**Expected Start Date: Summer, 2016**

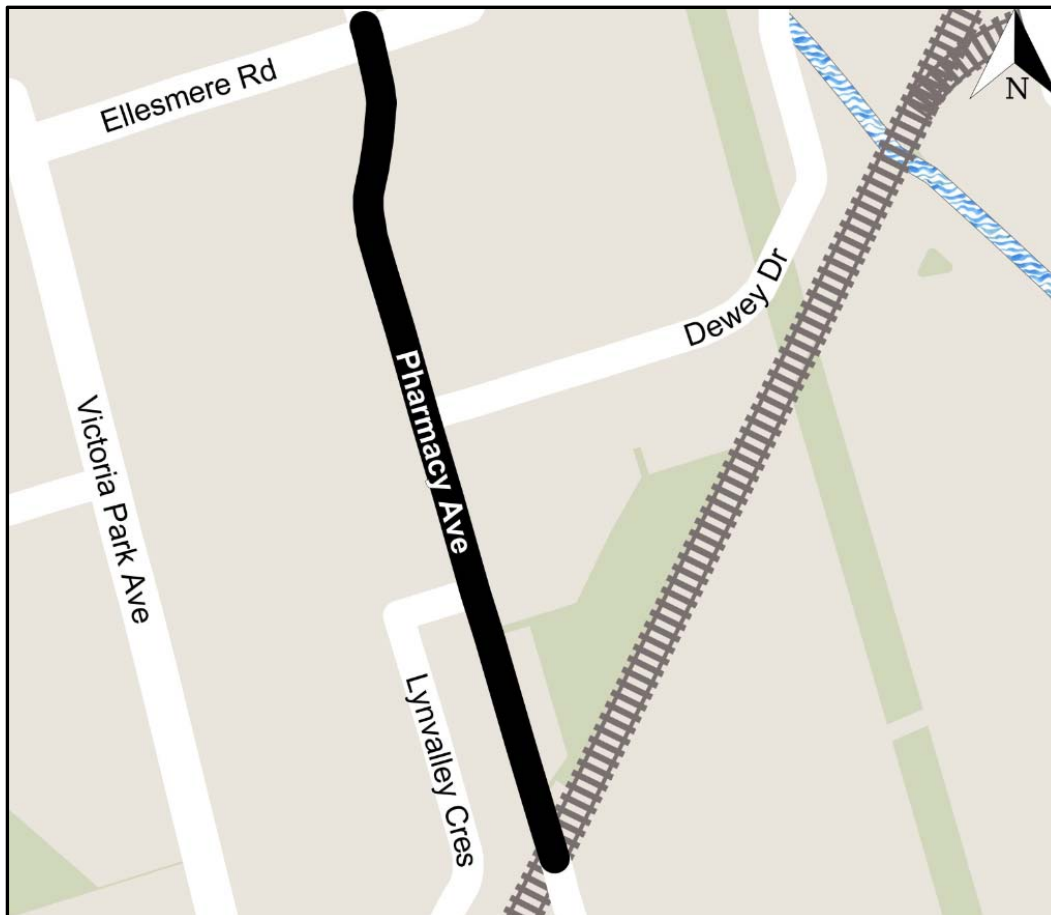
**Expected End Date: Fall, 2016**

The City of Toronto is planning to resurface the road on Pharmacy Avenue from Ellesmere Road to the CPR Bridge (north side). Our inspection of the road shows that it needs repaving and sections of damaged curb and sidewalk need to be replaced to bring them to a state of good repair.

This work is part of the City's comprehensive and coordinated strategy to rehabilitate and upgrade our roads for current and future needs. The work is part of the Council-approved 2016 Capital Works Program.

## WHAT TO EXPECT BEFORE CONSTRUCTION

- Work crews will mark sidewalks and curbs requiring replacement and the locations of underground utilities, such as gas, water and cable so that the construction work does not interfere with these utilities.
- Affected properties will receive a Construction Notice approximately two weeks before work begins with more information about the work.
- Work in the boulevard in front of homes and commercial properties is expected. This work includes removing and replacing driveways, municipal sidewalks and grassed boulevards, where necessary.
- Property owners should remove items located within City property limits (boulevard), such as landscaping and or decorative objects before work starts. If you have a sprinkler system within the boulevard, please contact the Project Manager listed below.



**Accessible Accommodation:** Residents who require accommodation (level entry, longer notice, etc.) must contact the **Project Manager** to arrange for access during the construction period.
