Introducing the Special Needs Resource team

Every licensed child care program in the City of Toronto has an assigned Special Needs Resource person. These professionals provide the consistent support needed so that every child can take part in the child care program of his or her family's choice.

These supports include:

- * Regular visits to programs
- * Early identification and intervention
- * Individual consultation
- * Program consultation
- * Program adaptations
- * Staff, provider and parent training
- * Environmental assessments
- * Service coordination and referral
- * Enhanced staffing/intensive resource support, when needed.
